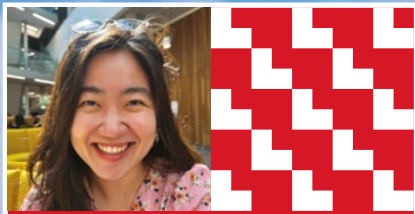

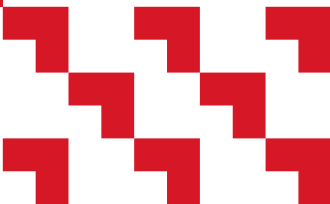
Welcoming, diverse and packed with things to do, London is a great place to live, work and study.

CAREERS UNLOCKED

Our students will be inspired, challenged and supported as they put their knowledge and skills to the test at City St George's. We offer lifelong careers support to our students, from the moment they start studying with us, to long after they graduate. Our Careers and Employability team bridges academia and business by providing high-quality careers support in collaboration with employers and academic departments.



Embedded employability

Our master's courses are designed to meet the needs of employers. Through an optional embedded employability module, our students are equipped with the tools to improve their career prospects, whether they are just entering the job market, considering a change in direction, or aiming to advance in their current roles. Students will also be able to choose to complete their dissertation in collaboration with an employer, gaining valuable industry experience and building professional connections in a field aligned with their future ambitions. 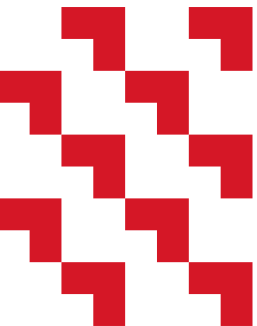
Our Students' Union

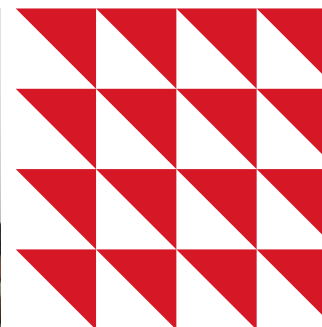


STUDYING MADE AFFORDABLE

While a postgraduate course can greatly improve the career prospects of our students, some worry about the financial burden. At City St George's, we try to alleviate this by providing financial advice and encouraging students to apply for the different sources of funding available, whether that be scholarships, studentships or loans.

Studentships, scholarships and hardship funds

As well as the wide range of scholarships available to students across all six of our Schools, there are externally funded studentships and scholarships including Chevening Scholarships, Commonwealth Scholarships and Research Council studentships. We also support students experiencing financial difficulties via the Hardship Fund and disabled students may be granted the Disabled Students' Allowance.

Postgraduate loans (UK students only)

Students undertaking a master's degree can apply for up to £12,858* loan to help pay for tuition fees or cover the cost of living expenses. Students interested in undertaking a research degree can apply for a Postgraduate Doctoral Loan of up to £30,301*, divided equally across each year of the course.

This keystone broadcasting course is highly rated by employers and has an exceptional national and international reputation. Students benefit from a diverse cohort with access to an unparalleled network of alumni. The focus is on multimedia production, preparing students for their first job in television, radio, podcasting, social and digital journalism. On news days, students work in groups, covering news, sport, entertainment and current affairs. Their final project is a short documentary for television or radio, made individually or in pairs. These have won many awards from the Royal Television Society and British Journalism Training Council (BJTC). The course has a careers-focused module, and as part of the BJTC accreditation they must complete 15 days' placement.

 Career opportunities

Alumni hold prestigious broadcast news and current affairs jobs in the UK and worldwide. Students join award-winning alumni at major broadcasters like Sky, BBC, ITV, Channel 5, ITN, CNN, ABC and various national radio stations, press agencies and production companies in podcasting and television.

Global Financial Journalism MA

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course has proved itself to be the perfect training ground for many of the world's leading news organisations. It covers both journalism skills and specialist financial knowledge, allowing graduates to hit the ground running, reporting on important international issues from global economics to companies and financial markets. Generous funding from the Marjorie Deane Foundation allows students to visit New York and South-East Asia to learn first-hand about global superpower economies. The course is truly distinctive in its international reach and breadth of opportunity. Upon completion, students will have an extensive education in the best professional practice of reporting global business and financial stories.

 Career opportunities

Graduates have gone on to join Bloomberg, Reuters, the *Financial Times*, the BBC, *The Telegraph*, *The Wall Street Journal*/ Dow Jones, CNBC and the *New York Times*, as well as specialised publications such as *Investor's Chronicle* and *Retail Week*. Former students work as journalists in major financial centres including London, Hong Kong, Paris, New York, Tokyo, Dubai and Mumbai.

International Journalism MA

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course has been running since 1982 and has built a worldwide reputation with well over 1,000 alumni working across the globe. Students become adept at broadcast, print and online journalism in a global context. They study international news and gain a profound understanding of international journalism from a UK and global perspective. Students practise journalism across platforms, explore theory and reflect on their practice. The course attracts students from all over the world who benefit from being in one of the world's most significant media cities. Students acquire comprehensive skills across video, audio, print, social media and digital journalism. They also benefit from a careers module that helps them build networks and prepare for the workplace.

Graduates work in global and national media and in allied occupations. Investigative Journalism MA

 Clerkenwell campus

 Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

This is an intense course that is designed to equip students with the reporting and research skills needed to produce investigations that matter. Basic reporting leads quickly to working with data, Open Source Intelligence (OSINT), public records and information gained from using access-to-information laws. Case studies of high-profile investigations are used to help students to ethically and legally investigate companies, organisations and individuals. Students will work individually and in small groups to complete several complex and ambitious investigative, and will produce journalism in audio, video and text. A careers module will also help students to establish contacts and find work. Many students have had investigations that they started while on the course published by professional outlets.

 Career opportunities

Graduates have been employed by *The Times*, *The Sunday Times*, *The Daily Telegraph*, *The Guardian*, *the Daily Mail*, *The Spectator*, *The Economist*, *The New Statesman*, BBC Eye Investigates and Panorama, Channel 4 Dispatches, Radio 4 Current Affairs, Sky News, Bloomberg TV, CNN, the Bureau of Investigative Journalism, Global Witness, Project Brazen and openDemocracy.

A fast-paced, exciting course designed to train future reporters and editors of the world's leading media organisations, as well as those who want to freelance or start their own journalism enterprise. For more than 40 years, City St George's has had an exceptional reputation for training journalism's top talents. Students benefit from a central London location and unrivalled industry contacts. The course combines news reporting, interviewing, feature writing, editing, research and multimedia production with concern for professional standards and ethics. A wide range of electives allows students to explore specialist areas, and a careers-focused module helps prepare them for employment. Students can undertake the MA Journalism or choose to specialise, leading to the award of in MA Journalism (Sports) or MA Journalism (Arts and Lifestyle).

Journalism, Media and Globalisation (Erasmus Mundus) MA

 Clerkenwell campus

 Duration

Full-time: two years

This is a unique, two-year master's course that is part of the prestigious Erasmus Mundus programme. Students learn in a diverse setting with individuals from around the world.

As the course brings together five leading European institutions in journalism and media education, there is a wealth of international guest lecturers and academics. The first year is spent in Aarhus University (Denmark), the second at City St George's, the University of Amsterdam (Netherlands) or Charles University (Prague).

The course also offers exchange opportunities for students to travel to one of the following three institutions in the spring of the first year: University of California, Berkeley, USA; University of Technology Sydney, Australia; or Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile.

 Career opportunities

Students have gone on to work for The Wall Street Journal/Dow Jones, the BBC, Reuters, China Daily, Danish Broadcasting Corporation, Helsingin Sanomat, TV 2 Norway, Xinhua News Agency, Bangkok Post, Associated Press and Platts. Others are working for international organisations, including the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and the European Commission, and for international corporations including Morgan Stanley.

Professional Publishers Association

This is a hugely successful and well-established course preparing students for a wide range of careers, from glossy consumer titles to international news journals. Skills learned include: writing long-form investigative features; arts and culture reviews; profile pieces; podcasts and video editing; designing and subbing; and picture editing. There is a strong entrepreneurial angle to the course and students learn how to research, create and launch new media products and engage audiences and a career-focused module helping students to prepare their CVs and network for work. Students also produce a print magazine and launch their own digital platform. Students learn from magazine and specialist journalists and around 30 visiting editors, commissioning editors and editorial directors from the UK's leading publishing houses.

 **Career opportunities**

Graduates occupy top positions in magazines, newspaper supplements and digital content providers, including *Harper's Bazaar*, *The Guardian Weekend*, *The Week*, *Stylist*, *GQ*, *The New Statesman* and *Cosmopolitan*; B2B magazines such as *Architects' Journal*, *Chemist + Druggist* and *Travel Weekly*; customer magazines such as *BA's High Life*; and major newspapers including *The Standard*, *Daily Mirror* and *The Sunday Times*.

Part-time: two years

Based in the heart of commercial and literary London, City St George's has a distinguished track record in helping students to publication. This course welcomes students working in fiction, genre fiction and creative non-fiction and is designed to develop their creative writing skills through a variety of taught classes, workshops and supervisions. As well as core and elective modules, students take the Creative writing workshop and Special studies modules, in which they share their work-in-progress with their fellow students, and analyse and learn from contemporary literary fiction, genre fiction or creative non-fiction texts.

Students also benefit from individual supervision across the year by our experienced lecturers, who are all successful published authors, and work towards their final submission of a 15,000-word piece.

 **Career opportunities**

The course helps students to develop a practical understanding of the different elements and genres of creative writing. It also equips them with a range of transferable subject-specific skills. In addition to publishing their creative work, graduates go into fields such as journalism, publishing and literary agencies, digital media, cultural organisations, charities and teaching. Published alumni of City St George's postgraduate Creative Writing degrees include Laura Shepherd-Robinson (*Blood & Sugar*), Catherine Menon (*Fragile Monsters*) and David Young (*Stasi Child*).

MFA

 **Clerkenwell campus** **Duration**Full-time: two years
Part-time: three or four years

This two-year full-time course is for students who want to develop advanced creative writing skills and complete a longer, potentially publishable piece of creative writing.

The first year of the course follows the taught curriculum of the MA Creative Writing. In the second year students work under close supervision of City St George's distinguished staff of experienced lecturers and published authors to complete an independent creative writing project in their chosen genre of 40,000–60,000 words, which can be a continuation of the 15,000-word project from the MA course.

Students who begin the MA Creative Writing course may apply to transfer to the MFA after two terms of taught provision. However, this is not currently an option for students on a Student Visa.

 **Career opportunities**

The course is for students who want to develop their ambitions as creative writers while receiving structured support in a higher education environment. It is designed to provide a platform for a creative writing career. The course also offers training and experience transferable to other areas of employment such as professional writing, journalism, publishing and the teaching of creative writing.

The course is ideal for students who want to have a grounding in the business of publishing while fostering their creative ambitions.

Attracting a diverse group of students with a wide range of backgrounds, the course welcomes both experienced and aspiring writers and will appeal to anyone writing in the genres of literary fiction, fantasy, young adult, dystopian fiction and crime. Students gain the knowledge and skills relevant to professional practice in commercial publishing settings which produce creative content for both print and digital formats. Delivered by industry professionals and leading published authors, the course has a strong track record in students winning literary prizes, gaining representation, securing publishing contracts, and obtaining employment in the industry.

 **Career opportunities**

Aspiring writers enjoy exposure to publishers and our alumni successes include Ashley Hickson-Lovence's *The 392* (Own It) and *Your Show* (Faber), Sonya Lalli's *The Arrangement* (Orion) and Carlie Sorosiak's *If Birds Fly Back* (HarperTeen) and *I, Cosmo* (Nosy Crow). Students on the course have won the Orwell Society's Dystopian Fiction Prize for three years running. The industry placement option also provides students with the opportunity to gain invaluable work experience in a wide range of London-based trade, academic and children's publishers.

Part-time: two years

Students can shape the cultural and creative sector and gain experience inside leading arts organisations (London-based or international).

On completion of the course, students are able to evaluate and integrate the theories and practices of culture, policy and management.

The curriculum was developed in consultation with senior creative industry figures so students' learning is attuned to the latest insights from the sector. The course has several elective modules to choose from, meaning students can customise their learning to become competent professionals ready to start, continue or change their career.

 **Career opportunities**

Launched in 1974, the pioneering course has over 3,000 alumni including key figures such as Tate Britain Director Alex Farquharson and UN World Tourism Organisation Culture Adviser Jin Yung Woo.

Graduates find employment in creative industries globally, from orchestras to film, fashion, events and museums and from marketing to policy and management. Students have found work with UCCA Center for Contemporary Art, Beijing; the Royal Opera, London; and Dior, Paris.

The course allows students to master brand communication in today's diverse media landscape. It focuses on building essential skills in digital content creation, campaign pitching and persuasive communication. Students then advance to the specialisation phase, honing expertise in branding, digital marketing, advertising and brand storytelling.

With a strong emphasis on direct and digital communication practices, students learn how to create compelling branded digital content, engage audiences with cutting-edge media strategies, and enhance brand profiles, across commercial sectors and industries.

The course prepares students for leadership roles in marketing, advertising, brand management and related fields.

 **Career opportunities**

Upon graduation, students enter a broad range of roles in content marketing, production, marketing and advertising, brand, event planning, writing and publishing, human resources, broadcast and news media, market research, data analysis, fundraising and research (for think-tanks, NGOs and government departments).

The course provides a thorough grounding in the social and institutional context of digital culture and global media industries and prepares graduates for positions in professional areas such as social media marketing and health communications. The methodological approaches and research tools learned on the course provide further skills that can be applied in the workplace.

Elective modules allow students to specialise their course to their own areas of interest, viewing broader social issues through the lens of media and communication technologies. Students work with a supervisor to create an individual research project that is tailored to their research passions and desired field of employment.

The course has an outstanding record for graduate employability.

Graduates have entered a wide variety of careers. Positions include Marketing Manager, Business Development and Relationship Manager, Communication and Advocacy Officer, HR Advisor and Communications Consultant.

Media Management MA

 Clerkenwell campus

 Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

This course will give students the opportunity to become creative leaders who will innovate the film, television, gaming and advertising – in London, the worldwide hub for media.

Combining the strengths of Bayes Business School and the Department of Media, Culture and Creative Industries, this course will give students the opportunity to learn how to manage media organisations strategically, lead creative people ethically, navigate the regulatory environment adeptly, interpret financial documents effectively, and target audiences precisely.

We teach a practical focus on innovative leadership in building sustainable and diverse media organisations in the age of AI and big data.

Module assessments are based on real-world case studies or industry briefs, providing students with hands-on experience. Students will respond to live debates in media management, from #MeToo to ChatGPT.

 Career opportunities

This course enables students to take on management and leadership roles in media. These range from operational to strategic management or business functions and include leadership positions in both private and publicly funded media organisations, not to mention project management and consultant roles in the film, television, gaming, advertising, publishing and related creative sectors.

Podcasting MA

 Clerkenwell campus

 Duration

Full-time: twelve months

This course has been developed after extensive consultation with industry leaders including the BBC, Sony, Spotify and Acast, who believe it will be a gamechanger. It recognises that podcasting is a mature and multi-million-pound industry requiring a very specific set of skills. Students will learn how to identify and develop ideas, pitch and understand business models to get the product made, research and book great guests, record and process compelling audio and video, design images and social media campaigns to get products noticed and build brand loyalty. Students will cover core journalistic skills like law and ethics, but also skills in creative storytelling and performance using music, sport, true crime and even comedy.

 Career opportunities

Graduates hold some of the most influential roles in the podcasting sector. Recent graduates will join an alumni community of podcasters who can extend their learning beyond the classrooms and build a lifelong support network within the industry. The School has internationally acclaimed experts who are held in esteem by, and work with, UNCTAD, UNESCO, World Intellectual Property Organisation, the UK Government's Department for Culture, Media and Sport, the British Council and the EU.

The research strengths of the Department of Journalism include gender and diversity issues in journalism; international journalism including humanitarian news and coverage of conflicts; journalism policy, practice and ethics including digital media ethics; and new and emerging journalism. The Department enjoys considerable strength in partnerships through its close connections with diverse

industry bodies and through its collaborations across City St George's.

The School offers supervision for research courses across its core disciplines:

- **Culture and creative industries** (creative economy, arts and cultural management and creative cities)
- **English** (literature, creative writing, publishing and popular culture, global, transnational, noncanonical and marginalised Anglophone literatures)
- **Journalism** (business and leadership, digital practice, ethics, history, law and regulation, representation and democratisation, new and emerging journalism)
- **Media and communications** (advertising, film and television, fashion communication, health communication, media audiences, media industries, media and communications policy, political communication, social media, public relations, new media forms and formats such as digital content platforms, streaming and video on demand)
- **Music** (ethnomusicology, musicology, composition and technology).

Students start out studying an MPhil, then transfer onto the PhD pathway after one year of satisfactory academic progress. Students might be required to complete specialist taught modules during the MPhil year.

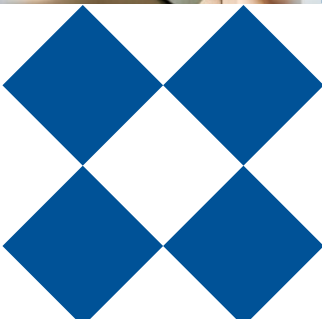
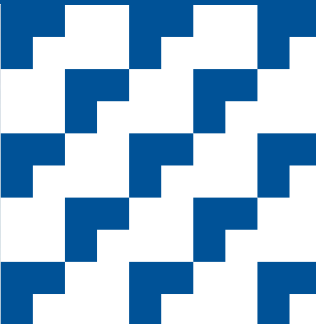
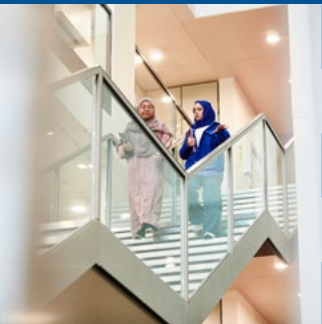

The demand for specialists in health economics continues to increase as more advanced and expensive healthcare puts pressure on policy decision-makers and industry managers. Health economists' responsibilities range from identifying new interventions in healthcare that compete with existing ones to appropriate economic modelling to aid decision-making for funding.

The course is designed to train students to meet the current demand for health economists in the field of health technology assessment. It introduces students to the conceptual basis for economic evaluation, quantitative methods and modelling skills relevant to healthcare decision-making.

It includes modules in economic evaluation, health economics, quantitative methods, economic evaluation workshops (modelling), welfare economics and epidemiology. Students are also required to write a dissertation.

 Career opportunities

Students will prepare for careers in economic consultancies, think-tanks, the pharmaceutical industry, professional associations, government bodies, NGOs and research.

Designed to meet the growing need for health economics specialists with the demand for more advanced and costly healthcare, this course is intended for those with and without an economics background. Students will be introduced to how economic principles are applied to the analysis of decisions by consumers, firms and governments regarding health and healthcare.

Students can choose between two pathways. In the research pathway, students complete seven taught modules and write a dissertation. In the literature review/company project pathway, students complete eight taught modules and produce either a literature review or carry out a project with an outside organisation (e.g., private firm, local authority, NHS trusts). Core modules cover topics such as health economics, economic evaluation, microeconomics, and quantitative methods. Students can also select elective modules from a wide range of theoretical and applied options.

The course explores issues and problems in the study of foreign policy through an engagement with the theoretical and real-world dimensions of foreign policy analysis, a salient strand of international relations theory. It focuses on traditions and techniques in the areas of strategy, diplomacy and decision-making in foreign policy affairs.

The course deals with a range of topics relating to the economic, political and professional dimensions of diplomacy and foreign policy with reference to key regions. It provides students with a research-led education in this dynamic field.

Students explore professional approaches to policy formulation, decision-making and negotiation within organisations and between competing parties.

Through exercises, debates and simulations, students experiment with different ways of defining problems, reconciling competing agendas, facilitating dialogue and mitigating risk.

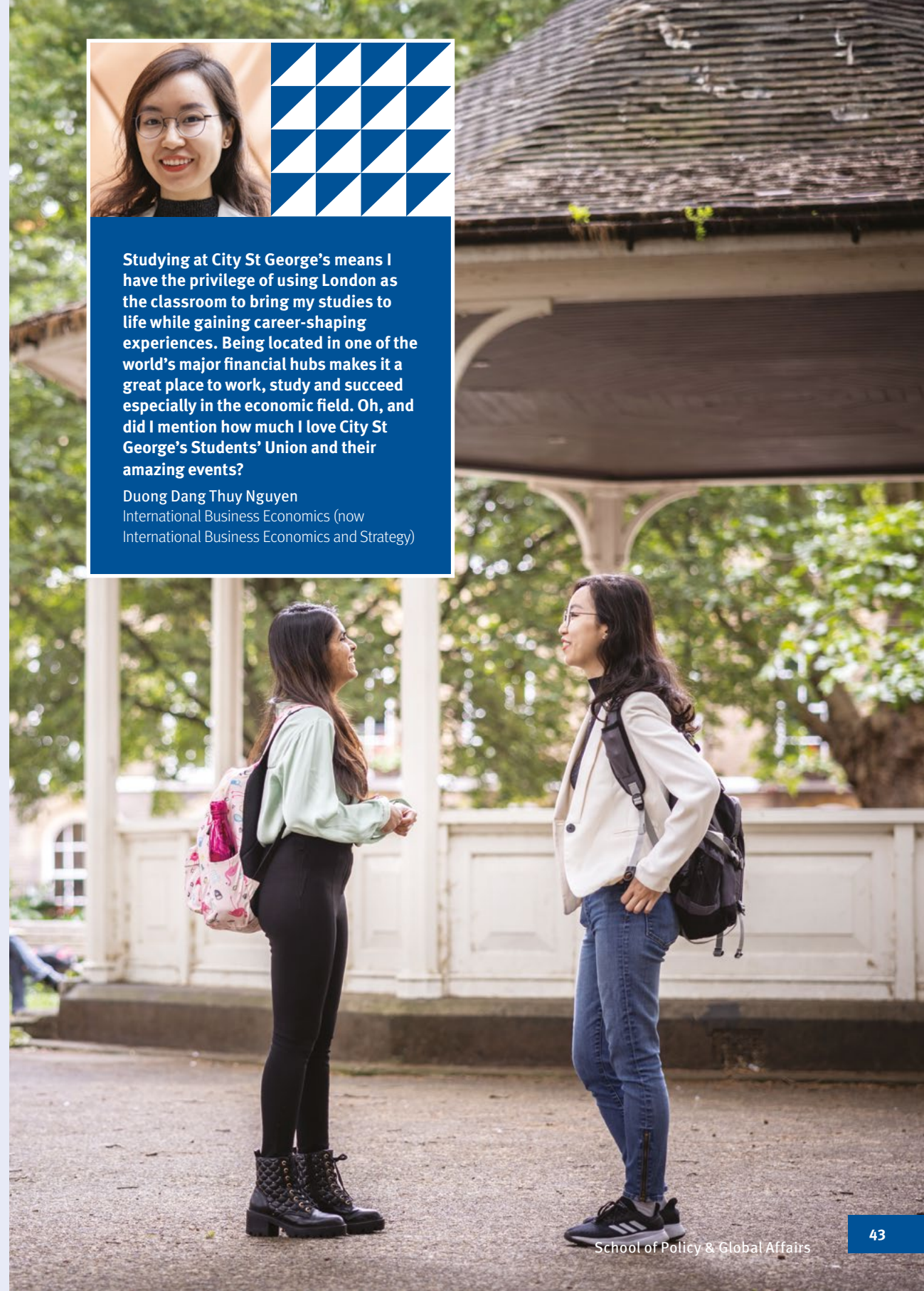

At the heart of contemporary international politics are new challenges and enduring problems. Increasing concerns such as conflict, inequality, human rights violations, displacement, and climate change make the study of international politics more topical than ever.

The course provides students with an opportunity to examine and critically evaluate key political dilemmas of international significance. It focuses on the analysis of international affairs using theoretical approaches and real-world case studies.

Students will learn from academics who are actively affecting policy, conducting research that is shaping international organisations, such as the UNHRC and European governments' responses to the resettlement of refugees and other displaced persons. Understanding crime and crime control in the 21st century requires researchers and professionals to think globally and work across disciplines. The course provides students with an advanced understanding of research and practice. It develops students' ability to analyse the problem of crime and crime control strategies, equipping them with the knowledge required to become experts in their chosen fields. Students also complete an individual research project.

Teaching is delivered by criminologists, holding expertise in policing and surveillance studies, criminal behaviour, victimology, feminist criminology, youth studies, penology, criminal justice policy and urban criminology.

City St George's also has a centre for justice reform, which is a group of researchers, practitioners, activists and community members driving an ambitious evidence-based agenda for urgent criminal justice reform.

 Career opportunities

The course is ideal for students who wish to pursue careers in criminal justice and related professions. It also provides a strong foundation for careers in research, policy development or campaigning. The course furthermore offers insights and knowledge transfer into employment positions that ask for skills in enforcement, regulation and compliance.

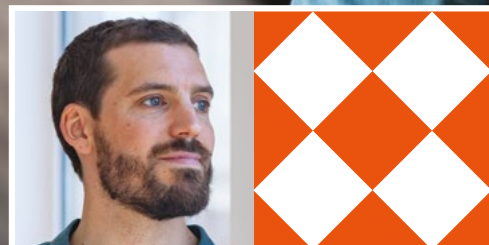

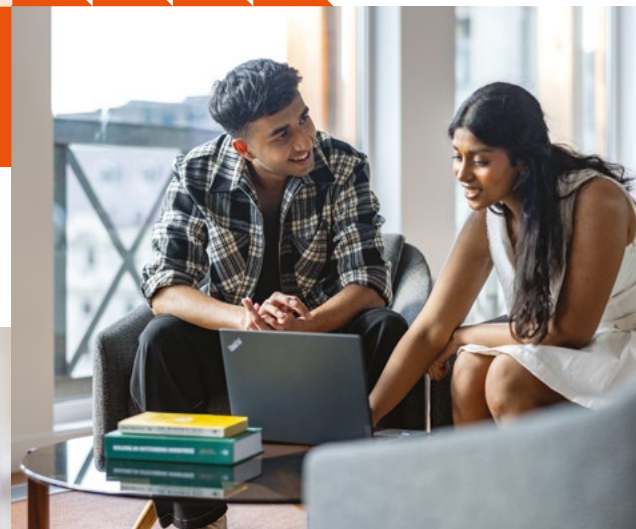

The course concentrates on the mathematical and financial theory required to develop new products for hedging and risk management. It provides the tools necessary to undertake high-quality research in financial and academic institutions. Students acquire an in-depth knowledge and understanding of financial mathematics. This includes financial theory and stochastics along with probability theory and programming. These are then applied for asset pricing, interest rates modelling and risk management.

Graduates are suited for jobs in investment houses involved in derivatives valuation and portfolio management or research departments within banks and consultancy firms. They are also equipped for careers involving the development of pricing and risk management models and their testing, as risk analysts or quantitative analysts.

Applied Biomedical Science

RNA vaccines, gene therapies, and GLP inhibitors are advancing medicine. But what drives the next innovation?

This course is designed to help students discover what it takes to turn research discoveries into new diagnostic tools, therapies and preventive strategies for human diseases.

The pioneering modules cover key areas such as bioinformatics, population health research and personalised medicine.

Students will work with leading experts and explore how to overcome challenges in clinical trials, integrate diverse expertise and apply research to healthcare challenges.

The three-month project, based in London (or abroad through the Turing Scheme), provides the opportunity to formulate a specific research question, analyse the data and present the findings.



Career opportunities

This course is designed to address the skills shortage in the biotech/pharmaceutical sector. Students develop expertise in bench-to-bedside pathways, genomic diagnostics and data analysis.

Graduates will also be prepared for roles in medical diagnostic labs, with practical skills in safe chemical handling, DNA analysis, protein studies and tissue culture.

Behavioural Economics applies psychological insights to human behaviour to investigate how people make economic decisions under various conditions of constraint (e.g., time and knowledge) and influence (e.g., social pressure). This is an important field in modern economics and the social sciences more generally.

Commercial organisations have long known the limitations of individual decision-making and they routinely use this knowledge in their commercial practices (e.g., the anchoring effect of minimum payment on credit cards). The real-world implications of behavioural economics are varied and significant and acknowledged to provide a powerful and cost-effective approach to improving human welfare.

The course is taught by psychologists and economists offering students a good foundation in both disciplines.

 Career opportunities

Behavioural economists use data to better understand human behaviour. These highly valuable skills can be applied in a range of professions, for example to formulate policies or to analyse consumer behaviour. There is increasing demand for behavioural economists across different sectors, including financial trading and risk assessment, consumer psychology and marketing, consulting and public policy. The research focus of the course also allows graduates to proceed to PhD level research in economics or psychology.

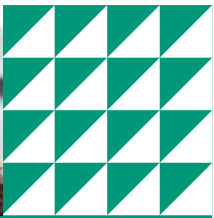

Postgraduate research degrees



The School of Health & Medical Sciences is committed to enhancing health and wellbeing by partnering with healthcare users and practitioners to deliver research that is innovative, usable and policy-relevant.

The School's research centres focus on areas such as: maternal and child health, infection and immunity, applied vision, language and communication science, psychology, mental health, cardiovascular science, genomics, healthcare innovation, neuroscience, cell biology, population health and food policy. We offer a supportive environment for individuals wishing to pursue a postgraduate research degree.

Students receive dedicated supervision and a range of development activities based on their training needs. These might include patient and public engagement, methods of research analysis, interpretation and dissemination strategies. They may also choose to gain experience in teaching.

Academic staff and students benefit from recent investment in new facilities, bespoke laboratories, public-facing clinics and simulation suites. Additionally, the School is uniquely placed to offer PhD students access to University of London research facilities, including its own extensive clinical networks.

Examples of recent research projects include: public health nutrition advocacy in the UK; investigating the complex genomics of heritable cardiac diseases; patients' quality of life with glaucoma; risk perception regarding pregnancy and childbirth; the role of type 2 diabetes, retinal vasculopathy and inflammation in post-stroke dementia; addressing health inequalities in disadvantaged groups using health psychology theory; and evidence and neurodevelopment and risk factors in schizophrenia.

There are several routes to an MPhil/PhD degree within the School:

- **Major Thesis:** students undertake a significant piece of original research and write a thesis based on that research.
- **Thesis incorporating Prospective Publications:** students undertake a significant piece of original research and prepare articles for publication in peer-reviewed academic journals. In the thesis, the published articles may be embedded within chapters which contain the critical analysis, or they may be interspersed among chapters written in traditional thesis style.
- **Prior Publication:** students who have published a significant body of articles in peer-reviewed academic journals spend between one and two years writing an extended treatise which draws this research together with analysis of previously published work by others into the context of a single overarching thesis.

The course provides students with a choice of either taking an advocacy module or an introduction to the solicitors professional qualification, depending on their career intentions.

Alongside fundamental legal knowledge, students will develop essential legal skills such as research, analysis, problem-solving and advocacy. These are prerequisites for taking the professional training course for the Bar. They are also the basis of the knowledge needed for those intending to become solicitors.

Students have the option to convert to an LLB degree by taking further law modules.

The senior status law course is a rigorous and competitive programme and allows non-law graduates to receive an LLB law degree in just two years.

Students have the opportunity to gain skills and knowledge in core legal subjects and specialist areas of law.

In year one, candidates study four of the seven core foundation subjects usually covered in an undergraduate law degree. In year two, students take the remaining three core subjects and have the opportunity to enhance their knowledge of particular areas of law by choosing six elective modules.

The course attracts international students from around the world, Canada in particular. Canadian law-specific electives can be chosen in year two.

There are opportunities for students to develop legal skills in mooting, legal research and legal writing, and to take part in various pro bono projects.

Career opportunities

Successful completion of the course qualifies students to progress to one of our two professional courses: the Solicitors' Practice Programme (SPP) for solicitors or the Bar Vocational Studies (BVS) programme for barristers. Students can also pursue a Master of Laws (LLM).

The course offers the choice of three different routes depending on whether students simply wish to qualify as a barrister or whether they wish to further enhance their employability and develop specialist knowledge and skills.

The course is available as full-time or part-time study. Students who choose to study part-time will have classes on two days per week, over two years, allowing them to work alongside their studies.

Students may choose to complete the Postgraduate Diploma, which includes only the modules required for the compulsory vocational Bar qualification. Alternatively, they may choose the Postgraduate Diploma with electives, which includes two additional modules in specialist areas of professional practice, allowing students to further develop a critical understanding of the law, procedure and real-world insights in the context of those areas.

Students also have the option of obtaining an LLM by completing a practice-focused article or clinical legal education module (which includes undertaking supervised clinical legal work)* in addition to the compulsory vocational qualification for the Bar and the specialist modules. This route aims to enhance students' knowledge of substantive law and/or legal skills in relation to a particular area of professional practice and offers the opportunity for extended practical experience.

**The clinical legal education module is only available to full-time students.*

 Career opportunities

On successful completion, students will have obtained the vocational stage of training for the Bar of England and Wales required to become a barrister.

As well as preparing students for a successful career as a barrister, the range of skills developed on this programme are also highly transferable to successful careers in a wide range of other areas. The Solicitors' Practice Programme is designed for those preparing for the Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE), the route to qualifying as a solicitor in England and Wales.

Over two 10-week terms, students will study material that will help prepare them to pass SQE1 and SQE2. Students may exit at this stage with a Postgraduate Diploma.

The Master of Laws (LLM) pathway provides an additional 5-week elective term and a legal practice research project to deepen students' understanding of an area of legal practice that is of particular interest.

Students will build on their existing legal knowledge and will acquire the knowledge and skills required both for the SQE assessments and for practising as a solicitor.

Our Future Solicitors Advisory Service provides dedicated advice to help our students to secure the workplace experience they will need in order to qualify as a solicitor.

Students can also participate in the School's pro bono activities and work with real clients.

PhD students are assigned two supervisors to support them throughout their research. They also benefit from the School's Research Training Programme which focuses on research skills and methodologies, employability skills, career management and personal development.

PhD students become part of a stimulating research environment by participating in the activities of the School's research centres, institutes and groups.

The award of a PhD requires the submission of a thesis for examination at a *viva voce* (oral examination) by two examiners, at least one of whom is external to City St George's. The thesis must be an original and substantial piece of work which makes a contribution to the relevant literature. All students are initially registered for an MPhil degree. Those students who wish to proceed to a PhD must upgrade within 18 months (30 months for part-time students).

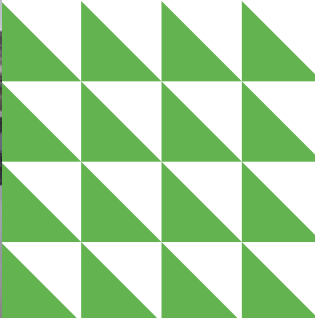
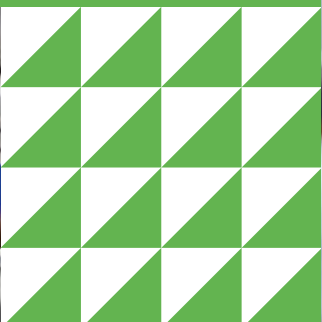

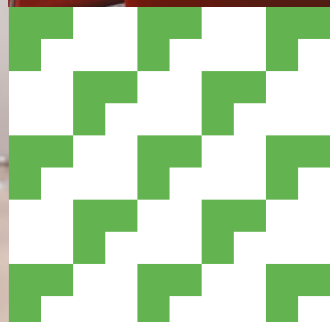

Postgraduate research degrees

The School offers the following types of research degrees: PhD by Major Thesis; PhD by Prospective Publication; PhD by Prior Publication; and MPhil.

The School is home to the following research centres, comprising teams of academic staff with international reputations in their fields: Software Reliability; gi (data visualisation); Human-Computer Interaction Design; Artificial Intelligence; Mathematics; Biomedical Engineering; Sensors and Instrumentation; Photonics and Instrumentation; Sustainable and Resilient Civil Engineering; Systems, Aeronautics and Aerospace; Autonomy and Control; Thermo-Fluids; and London Space Innovation.

All doctoral students are initially registered as MPhil students, except when they have transferred from another institution and have provided suitable and appropriate evidence that permits direct registration as a PhD student.

A research degree provides a superb opportunity for able students to dig deep into a specialist area to advance knowledge for the benefit of many. It is a remarkably satisfying and rewarding venture.

Applying to City St George's

Choosing a postgraduate course at City St George's is a great next step towards a rewarding career.

How to apply

Applications for the majority of postgraduate courses need to be made directly to City St George's. To apply, visit the webpage of the intended course of study and click on the 'How to apply' tab to read more about the application process, including any supporting documentation required and to access the online application system.

With a few exceptions, postgraduate courses do not have a fixed application deadline and operate on a rolling admission basis. Applications will close when the course is full, so students are encouraged to apply as early as possible. Where a deadline is in place, further information can be found on the specific course webpage.

Entry requirements

Entry requirements vary for each course and are listed on the individual course webpages.

Applicants for postgraduate study should normally hold a university honours degree in a relevant subject. However, if students do not hold an honours degree (or an equivalent qualification) but have suitable experience or professional qualifications, they may still be accepted for a master's course or a Postgraduate Diploma at the discretion of the relevant School.

Students who are in the final year of their undergraduate studies or are yet to receive their English Language test results can still apply for most postgraduate courses at City St George's. Their applications will be assessed based on predicted grades and, if all other entry criteria are met, they might receive a conditional offer that is subject to them satisfying the specified requirements.

Pre-master's courses provide a route to several of City St George's courses for international students that do not qualify for direct entry. Students can take a City St George's-validated course with City St George's, University of London International Study Centre or study with City St George's partner, Kaplan. Courses at both providers guarantee progression to City St George's for students that meet the required grades.

Tuition fees and living costs

Tuition fees vary by course and further information can be found on the website. Remember that tuition fees do not include the cost of accommodation, so students will need to budget for this along with flights, food, travel, books and personal items. Where necessary, our temping agency,

Unitemps, can help students find suitable work.

Some courses may require a tuition fee deposit following an offer of admission to confirm applicant's place on the course.

Visa requirements

Students are responsible for obtaining necessary visas and entry clearance into the UK and are advised to prepare in advance by researching the requirements for students from their home country. Information about applying for, and extending, visas to study is available on City St George's website.

If students have an existing Student visa that was issued for study at another university, college or school in the UK, they will need to complete a new Student visa application with the UK Home Office using a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from City St George's before they will be allowed to register.

A team of dedicated International Student Advisers can help with the visa application process.

English language requirements and courses

As City St George's courses are delivered in English, students whose first language is not English will need to demonstrate their English ability is sufficient to undertake degree-level study. English language requirements vary by course and are likely to be higher than the minimum English language requirements set by the Home Office for students requiring a visa. City St George's, University of London International Study Centre runs pre-session English courses during the summer to help students improve their English before their courses start. Bayes Business School postgraduate students are only eligible for Pre-session English if referred by the MSc Admissions team.

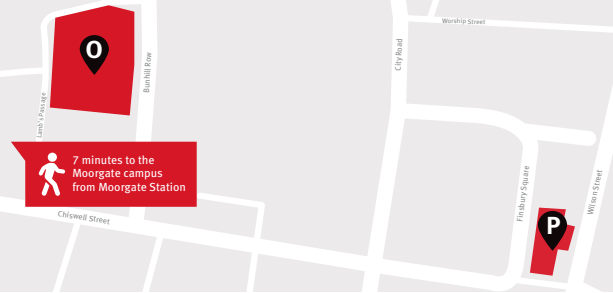
