Samson Folarin MA Investigative Journalism

I was already a seasoned journalist working in Lagos for the number one Nigerian newspaper, *The Punch*, but I wanted to have a greater impact in investigative journalism. This led me to City on a fully funded Chevening Scholarship, which is a UK Government award aimed at developing global leaders.

Transitioning from a professional to a student once again was quite the adjustment. I left education over 14 years ago, so returning to academia was challenging, not to mention relocating to a new country and navigating a different education system altogether.

Despite these initial challenges, my experience has been rewarding. Meeting students from different backgrounds broadened my worldview, helping to give me a global perspective on various issues and life in general.

City has equipped me with the necessary tools to excel in the next phase of my career. I enhanced my knowledge in various areas, and came to grips with the UK media landscape, particularly around legal frameworks and access to information. While Nigeria has its own challenges, the UK’s legal environment can sometimes feel restrictive to journalistic practice. On the other hand, journalists in the UK have access to substantial information through Freedom of Information requests.

At City, I’ve also had the opportunity to connect with professionals from industry leaders such as the BBC, LondonWorld, and *The Times*. I believe this proximity to experts, along with the rigorous curriculum, have taken my journalistic skills to the next level.

Looking ahead, I intend to use all that I’ve learned, and the networks I’ve made, to pursue investigative stories that resonate with a global audience.

As a child, I vividly remember visiting London with my parents and falling in love with the city. Since then, I wanted to return to the capital and fast forward fifteen years, my childhood dreams have come true.

After my undergraduate degree, I worked various part-time jobs and was fortunate enough to travel a bit. These experiences kindled my desire to understand the world more profoundly and is what led me to study politics, and City was one of the few institutions that offered a postgraduate course in diplomacy.

As an international student, I'm thoroughly enjoying studying in the UK. Living here has broadened my horizons far more than I could have imagined, exposing me to diverse cultures and viewpoints in a way that studying in the United States never did. A typical day for me starts with a quick workout at CitySport, which I find helps me to get into gear. Afterwards, I have lunch, attend lectures, and then get ahead of the following week's readings. I live in student accommodation, so I'm never far from everything I need.

My course has been incredibly enlightening, teaching me about political diversity and the idea that a solution effective in one country might not be suitable for another. One of the key skills I've honed is researching and remaining curious about subjects that ignite my interests. I believe my course has also instilled in me the empathy needed for a career in foreign services.

At first, it took a while to find a close-knit group, but it was rewarding once I did. The course's strength lies in its knowledgeable academics and the practical experience we get in the dedicated clinical skills suites. I deepened my understanding of healthcare systems and roles, and the lifecycle of care, making me a more well-rounded practitioner.

I also made the most of the opportunities available to me at City, from going on a variety of placements to being involvement in cutting-edge research. Training in Nursing Research allowed me to see innovative treatments in ICU, cardiac, and cancer care.

The City Law School has a rich history dating back to the 19th century and rooted in the prestigious tradition of the Inns of Court School of Law. This legacy of delivering esteemed legal education, coupled with its unrivalled central London location, made City an attractive prospect for me.

Following on from a Theology and Religion degree at Oxford, I initially came to City to study the Graduate Diploma in Law, and I loved it so much that I returned to complete my Bar training.

Classes on the Bar Vocational Studies course run three to four days a week alongside mock-court scenarios under the guidance of tutors. These hands-on sessions, supported by lectures on professional ethics and court procedures, lay a robust legal foundation. I believe this teaching also helped me secure a role with the Court of Appeal as a Judicial Assistant.

Socially, City fosters a supportive community. I’ve forged lasting friendships and balanced my studies with activities like boxing and weightlifting. There’s lots for students to sink their teeth into, from the many activities and events put on by the Students’ Union societies to CitySport, the largest student sports facility in central London.

I’ve thrown myself into pro bono work at City’s Employment Law Clinic and reached the final of the European Law Moot Court, where I developed my advocacy skills before leading experts in these fields. None of this would have been possible without City’s training and strong industry links.

The transition from a long military career to student life felt like starting over. While I'm in the lucky position of being able to self-fund my studies, it's also been helpful to pick-up part-time work as and when needed, and my course has allowed the flexibility for this.

My weekdays involve attending lectures that are typically from 9am to 5pm, with breaks in between to grab coffee or a bite to eat. City prides itself on its sustainable and Fairtrade certified status, so it's easy to find a tasty spot to take a breather or catch-up with friends.

Creative Writing

MA

 **Duration**

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

Based in the heart of commercial and literary London, City has a distinguished track record in helping students to publication. This course welcomes students working in fiction, genre fiction and creative non-fiction and is designed to develop their creative writing skills through a variety of taught classes, workshops and supervisions. As well as core and elective modules, students take the Creative Writing Workshop and Special Studies modules, in which they share their work-in-progress with their fellow students, and analyse and learn from contemporary literary fiction, genre fiction or creative non-fiction texts.

Students also benefit from individual supervision across the year by our experienced lecturers, who are all successful published authors, and work towards their final submission of a 15,000-word piece of creative writing in the genre of their choice.


 **Career opportunities**

The course helps students to develop a practical understanding of the different elements and genres of creative writing today. It also equips them with a range of transferable subject-specific and employability skills. In addition to publishing their creative work, graduates go on to employment in fields such as journalism, publishing and literary agencies, digital media, cultural organisations, charities and teaching. Published alumni of City's postgraduate Creative Writing degrees include Laura Shepherd-Robinson (*Blood & Sugar*), Catherine Menon (*Fragile Monsters*) and David Young (*Stasi Child*).

**Creative Writing**

MFA


 **Duration**

Full-time: two years
Part-time: three or four years

This two-year full-time course is for students who want to develop advanced creative writing skills and complete a longer, potentially publishable piece of creative writing.

The first year of the degree follows the taught curriculum of the MA Creative Writing. In the second year students work under close supervision of City's distinguished staff of experienced lecturers and published authors to complete an independent creative writing project in their chosen genre of 40,000–60,000 words, which can be a continuation of the 15,000-word project from the MA course.

Students who begin the MA Creative Writing course may apply to transfer to the MFA after two terms of taught provision. However, this is not currently an option for students on a Student Visa.

 **Career opportunities**

The course is for students who want to develop their ambitions as creative writers while receiving structured support in a higher education environment. It is designed to provide a platform for a creative writing career. The course also offers training and experience transferable to other areas of employment such as professional writing, journalism, publishing and the teaching of creative writing.

**Creative Writing and Publishing**

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course is ideal for students who want to have a grounding in the business of publishing while fostering their creative ambitions.

Attracting a diverse group of students with a wide range of backgrounds, the course welcomes both experienced and aspiring writers and will appeal to anyone writing in the genres of literary fiction, fantasy, young adult, dystopian fiction and crime. Students gain the knowledge and skills relevant to professional practice in commercial publishing settings which produce creative content for both print and digital formats. Delivered by industry professionals and leading published authors, the course has a strong track record in students winning literary prizes, gaining representation and securing publishing contracts.

 **Career opportunities**

Aspiring writers enjoy exposure to publishers and our alumni successes include Ashley Hickson-Lovence's *The 392* (Own It) and *Your Show* (Faber), Sonya Lalli's *The Arrangement* (Orion) and Carlie Sorosiak's *If Birds Fly Back* (HarperTeen) and *I Cosmo* (Nosy Crow). Students on the course have won the Orwell Society's Dystopian Fiction Prize for three years running. The industry placement option also provides students with the opportunity to gain invaluable work experience in a wide range of London-based trade, academic and children's publishers.

**Culture, Policy and Management**

MA


 **Duration**

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

Students can shape the cultural and creative sector and gain experience inside leading arts organisations (London-based or international).

On completion of the course, students are able to evaluate and integrate the theories and practices of culture, policy and management.

The curriculum was developed in consultation with senior creative industry figures so students' learning is attuned to the latest insights from the sector. The course has several elective modules to choose from, meaning students can customise their learning to become competent professionals ready to start, continue or change their career.

 **Career opportunities**

Launched in 1974, the pioneering course has over 3,000 alumni including key figures such as Tate Britain Director Alex Farquharson and UN World Tourism Organisation Culture Adviser Jin Yung Woo.

Graduates find employment in creative industries globally, from orchestras to film, fashion, events or museums and from marketing to policy or management. Students have found work with UCCA Center for Contemporary Art, Beijing; the Royal Opera, London; and Dior, Paris.

The course allows students to master brand communication in today's diverse media landscape. It focuses on building essential skills in digital content creation, campaign pitching and persuasive communication. Students then advance to the specialisation phase, honing expertise in branding, digital marketing, advertising, and brand storytelling.

With a strong emphasis on direct and digital communication practices, students learn how to create compelling branded digital content, engage audiences with cutting-edge media strategies, and enhance brand profiles, across commercial sectors and industries.

The course prepares students for leadership roles in marketing, advertising, brand management, and related fields. It is accredited by the Chartered Institute of Marketing.

Upon graduation, students enter a broad range of roles in content marketing, production, marketing and advertising, brand, event planning, writing and publishing, human resources, broadcast and news media, market research, data analysis, fundraising, and researcher (for think-tanks, NGOs, and government departments).

The course provides a thorough grounding in the social and institutional context of digital culture and global media industries and prepares graduates for positions in professional areas such as social media marketing and health communications. The methodological approaches and research tools learned on the course provide further skills that can be applied in the workplace.

Elective modules allow students to specialise their degree to their own areas of interest, viewing broader social issues through the lens of media and communication technologies. Students work with a supervisor to create an individual research project that is tailored to their research passions and desired field of employment.

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

Become a creative leader who will innovate the film, television, gaming, advertising and related industries – in London, the worldwide hub for the media industries.

Combining the strengths of the Bayes Business School and the Media, Culture and Creative Industries department, students will learn how to manage media organisations strategically, lead creative people ethically, navigate the regulatory environment adeptly, interpret financial documents effectively, and target audiences precisely.

We teach a practical focus on innovative leadership in building sustainable and diverse media organisations in the age of AI and big data.

Module assessments are authentic and based on real-world case studies or industry briefs, providing students with hands-on experience. Students will respond to live debates in media management, from #MeToo to ChatGPT.

Career opportunities

This course enables students to take on management and leadership roles in the media industries.

These range from operational to strategic management or business functions and include leadership positions in both private and publicly funded media organisations, not to mention project management and consultant roles in the film, television, gaming, advertising, publishing and related creative sectors.

Public Relations and Strategic Communications

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course equips students with a range of communication skills to excel in a dynamic and growing field.

Students will learn how to use communication tools to influence attitudes and individuals and learn the ethical obligations that come with this knowledge. They will progress to mastering media relations, reputation management, and social media/ community management.

Electives on topics like health and political communications allow students to customise their knowledge and have a chance to test their skills in a professional setting with a placement in the industry.

Students on this course will have the opportunity to connect with industry in a structured way, through guest speakers, bespoke placements, field trips and networking events. The School's staff have established strategic partnerships with London-based PR and marketing communication agencies, such as Fully Vested.

Career opportunities

Upon graduation, students find work in a broad range of roles, including digital content creation, public relations, marketing and communication, advocacy, programme management, event planning, community organising, fundraising, consultancy and research (for think-tanks, NGOs and government departments).

Publishing/ International Publishing

MA

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course covers all types of publishing, from trade and specialist publications to novels and non-fiction. Students complete core modules in term one with options in term two that cover topics including commercial and creative publishing projects, business, marketing, editorial and international aspects, not to mention digital publishing innovation. The course provides a thorough grounding in the drivers of commercial success for print and digital media, with a focus on digital content and e-delivery. Students are educated both by expert scholars and by leading publishing practitioners. Together, they support students to develop confidence and skills in the critical analysis of current global publishing conditions.

MA Publishing students have the opportunity to complete a 15-credit professional placement option and all of the MA International Publishing case studies relate directly to current publishing practice projects.

Career opportunities

Current industry knowledge and industry-focused projects are integral to the course, providing experience, contacts and enhanced publishing skills. Recent graduate job destinations include: Penguin Random House, Cambridge University Press, Bloomsbury, SAGE, Oxford University Press, Bonnier, Faber, Usborne, Nature, *The BMJ*, the *Financial Times* and Cravenhill Publishing.

Broadcast Journalism MA



Duration

Full-time: one year

This keystone broadcasting course is highly rated by employers and has an exceptional national and international reputation. Full-time: one year

Investigative Journalism MA



Duration

Full-time: one year

A pioneering course that is intense, challenging and designed to equip students with the reporting and research skills needed to produce investigations that matter. Basic reporting leads quickly to working with data, OSINT (open source intelligence), public records and information gained from using access-to-information laws.

Case studies of high-profile investigations help students understand how to ethically and legally investigate companies, organisations and individuals for issues of public concern, miscarriages of justice or abuse of power. Students will work individually and in small groups to produce high-quality text, audio and film. Students will complete several complex and ambitious investigative projects under the guidance of experienced professionals.



Career opportunities

Graduates move into employment across print, online and broadcast media. Journalism, Media and Globalisation (Erasmus Mundus) MA



Duration

Full-time: two years

This is a unique, two-year master's course that is part of the prestigious Erasmus Mundus programme (www.mundusjournalism.com). Students learn in a diverse setting with individuals from around the world.

As the course brings together five leading European institutions in journalism and media education, there is a wealth of international guest lecturers and academics. The first year is spent in Aarhus University (Denmark), the second at City, or the University of Amsterdam (Netherlands) or Charles University (Prague).

Full-time: one year

This is a hugely successful and well-established course preparing students for a wide range of careers in magazine and features journalism, both in print and online, from glossy consumer titles to international news journals. Skills learned include: writing long-form investigative features; arts and culture reviews; polished profile pieces; podcasts and video editing for online; designing and subbing print and online pages; and picture editing. There is a strong entrepreneurial angle to the course and students learn how to research, create and launch new media products and engage audiences. Students also produce a print magazine and launch their own digital platform.

The course is accredited by the Professional Publishers Association. Students learn from magazine and specialist journalists and around 30 visiting editors, commissioning editors and editorial directors from the UK's leading publishing houses.

Full-time: one year

Duration

Full-time: ten months
Part-time: two years

This course has been developed after extensive consultation with industry leaders including the BBC, Sony, Spotify, and Acast who believe it will be a gamechanger. It recognises that podcasting is a mature and multi-million-pound industry requiring a very specific set of skills. Students will learn how to identify and develop ideas, pitch and understand business models to get the product made, research and book great guests, record and process compelling audio and video, design images and social media campaigns to get products noticed and build brand loyalty. Students will cover core journalistic skills like law and ethics, but also skills in creative storytelling and performance using music, sport, true crime and even comedy.

Career opportunities

Graduates hold some of the most influential roles in the podcasting sector. Recent graduates will join an alumni community of podcasters who can extend their learning beyond the classrooms and build a lifelong support network within the industry. Music by Research MA

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

This course is aimed at students within the broad fields of music, including contemporary composition and sound practices (notated and digital music, sound arts and interdisciplinary practices), performance (classical, jazz, improvisation, popular and other musical traditions) and scholarship (historical musicology, ethnomusicology, music analysis and sound studies).

Engaging with professional practice lies at the core of the course, which is delivered by world-leading artists and scholars. Students have the opportunity to meet with international visitors during seminars and workshops and are invited to present their work to the public in the annual City Summer Sounds Festival and Postgraduate Research Conference. The course complements City's research centre SPARC (Sound Practice and Research @ City), which hosts an annual interdisciplinary symposium.

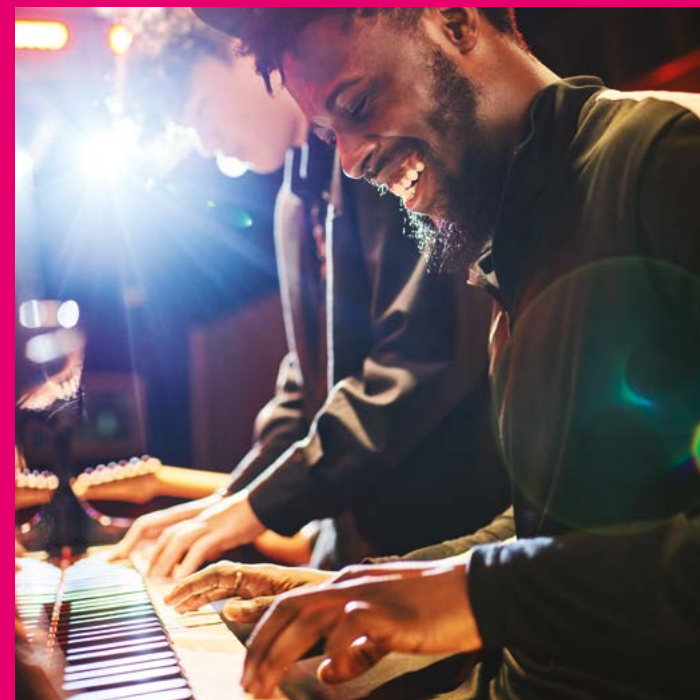

Postgraduate research degrees



The School of Communication & Creativity is an innovative and cutting-edge research environment. In the most recent Research Excellence Framework (REF2021), 89 per cent of the School's submitted research was rated as 3* (internationally excellent) and 4* (world-leading).

The School has internationally acclaimed experts who are held in esteem by, and work with, UNCTAD, UNESCO, World Intellectual Property Organisation, the Department for Culture, Media and Sport, the British Council and the EU.

The research strengths of the Department of Journalism include gender and diversity issues in journalism; international journalism including humanitarian news and coverage of conflicts; journalism policy, practice and ethics including digital media ethics; and new and emerging journalism. The Department enjoys considerable strength in partnerships through its close connections with diverse

industry bodies and through its collaborations across City.

The Department of Media, Culture and Creative Industries is committed to research that will make a positive difference in the world, pushing forward knowledge and practice in the creative and cultural industries through research, public engagement and impact activities, and by promoting research-led, non-traditional curricula. It has research-led academic provision, which deliberately decolonises and re-envisioned the curriculum.

Our Department of Performing Arts research strengths include ethnomusicology; the interface between music and technology; various relationships between music scholarship and performance; and music analysis. While its reach is international, City's central London base attracts sizeable audiences for its extensive series of concerts, conferences and symposia.

Research degrees MPhil/PhD

Duration

Full-time: up to four years
Part-time: up to seven years

The School offers supervision for research degrees across its core disciplines:

- **Culture and creative industries** (creative economy, arts and cultural management, and creative cities)
- **English** (literature, creative writing, publishing and popular culture; global, transnational, noncanonical and marginalised Anglophone literatures)
- **Journalism** (business and leadership, digital practice, ethics, history, law and regulation, representation and democratisation, new and emerging journalism)
- **Media and communications** (advertising, film and television, fashion communication, health communication, media audiences, media industries, media and communications policy, political communication, social media, public relations, new media forms and formats such as digital content platforms, streaming and video on demand)
- **Music** (ethnomusicology, musicology, composition and technology).

Students start out studying an MPhil, then transfer onto the PhD pathway after one year of satisfactory academic progress. Students might be required to complete specialist taught modules during the MPhil year.

Economic Evaluation in Healthcare

MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The demand for specialists in health economics continues to increase as more advanced and expensive healthcare puts pressure on policy decision-makers and industry managers. Health economists' responsibilities range from identifying new interventions in healthcare that compete with existing ones to appropriate economic modelling to aid decision-making for funding.

The course is designed to train students to meet the current demand for health economists in the field of health technology assessment. It introduces students to the conceptual basis for economic evaluation, quantitative methods and modelling skills relevant to healthcare decision-making.

It includes modules in economic evaluation, health economics, quantitative methods, economic evaluation workshops (modelling), welfare economics and epidemiology. Students are also required to write a dissertation.

Career opportunities

Students will prepare for careers in economic consultancies, think-tanks, the pharmaceutical industry, professional associations, government bodies, NGOs and research positions.

Graduate destinations include: NICE, IQVIA, the NHS, the Office of Health Economics, Wickenstones, FIECON, MSD, AbbVie, Parexel, Daiichi Sankyo, Pfizer and Eli Lilly.

MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course is designed to meet such increasing demand by incorporating both a solid education in economic theory and exposure to the field of finance through several specialised options. Most exciting is the unique opportunity to combine exposure to regulatory and policy aspects of finance with a thorough education in theory and quantitative methods.

All students must complete either a financial economics literature survey, financial economics dissertation or company project, which will affect the amount of elective modules they can take.

Health Economics and Policy

MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course is designed to meet the growing need for health economics specialists as the demand for more advanced and costly healthcare creates challenges and pressures for policy decision-makers and healthcare industry managers.

It is intended for those with and without an economics background alike and will introduce you to the way in which economics principles are applied to the analysis of decisions by consumers, firms and governments regarding health and healthcare.

There is a research path and a literature review path. There is a company project, which is 8 modules plus the project. For the former, students take seven modules and write a dissertation. For the latter, students take eight modules and produce a literature review. Core modules cover health economics, economic evaluation, microeconomics and quantitative methods. Elective modules can be chosen from a long list of theoretical and applied modules.

Career opportunities

The course prepares students for career opportunities in economic consultancies and think-tanks, teaching and research positions, professional associations and governmental bodies, NGOs and policy analysis for the pharmaceutical industry.

International politics

Diplomacy and Foreign Policy

MA

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course explores issues and problems in the study of foreign policy through an engagement with the theoretical and real-world dimensions of foreign policy analysis, a salient strand of international relations theory. It focuses on traditions and techniques in the areas of strategy, diplomacy and decision-making in foreign policy affairs.

The course deals with a range of topics relating to the economic, political and professional dimensions of diplomacy and foreign policy with reference to key regions. It provides students with a research-led education in this dynamic field.

Students explore professional approaches to policy formulation, decision-making and negotiation within organisations and between competing parties.

Through exercises, debates and simulations, students experiment with different ways of defining problems, reconciling competing agendas, facilitating dialogue and mitigating risk.

Career opportunities

The course is designed for those planning, or already engaged in, a career in the diplomatic service, journalism, international organisations (such as the UN or the EU) or NGOs (such as Amnesty International or Oxfam). It also prepares students for a career in political risk, international finance and think-tanks.

Global Political Economy

MA

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course provides a cutting-edge perspective on global economic and financial relations, inter-state competition, mechanisms of global governance and processes of transformation and change.

It consists of core modules on the history of global capitalism and contending approaches from across the political economy traditions. Students develop specialist knowledge through elective modules, covering issues such as economic and financial crises, international organisations and economic diplomacy, poverty and inequality, regionalisation and globalisation, states and sovereignty and the rise of new economic powers.

Understanding crime and crime control in the 21st century requires researchers and professionals to think globally and work across disciplines. The course provides students with an advanced understanding of research and practice. It develops students' ability to analyse the problem of crime and crime control strategies, equipping them with the knowledge required to become experts in their chosen fields. Students also complete an individual research project.

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years
(September and January starts)

Can be studied in-person or online

This course encompasses nutritional, medical, social, psychological and exercise sciences, and is delivered by research-active academics with diverse expertise. It examines how nutrition influences various health outcomes, particularly obesity and noncommunicable diseases.

The course also explores what strategies can be implemented to prevent and manage diet-related health conditions with consideration of psychological behaviour, socio-economic and environmental factors, food and nutrition policy, food waste and sustainability. The course emphasises the transformation of theories and knowledge in nutrition into practice while allowing students to develop professional and various transferrable skills including critical thinking, networking and leadership to enhance employability.

The course is accredited by the Association for Nutrition for the in-person mode only. Accreditation for the online mode is awaiting outcome.

 **Career opportunities**

After successful completion of the course, students will be able to undertake a range of nutrition-related roles including nutritionist, nutrition scientist, nutrition counsellor, wellness coach, health educator, health advocate and nutrition researcher in the public and private sectors, academia, food companies, non-governmental organisations, charities, and various levels of governmental organisations, both locally and internationally.

Full-time: one year

(September and January starts)

Can be studied in-person or online

Clinical Research MRes

Duration

Part-time: three years with
maximum registration of five
years (September, January
and May starts)

This course prepares students to become competent and confident (ACPs) within their speciality, sector or setting. The interdisciplinary modules guide and support students in developing their core capabilities and speciality-specific competencies across the four pillars: clinical practice, leadership and management, education, and research. These equip students with the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes (behaviours) to meet the requirements of the Multi-Professional Framework of Advanced Clinical Practice introduced by Health Education England in 2017.

Students develop the skills to safely assess, diagnose, manage, and treat or refer patients presenting with complex problems within their scope of practice. Depending on their professional qualifications and job role specification, students are enrolled on the Prescribing or Non-Prescribing route.

The courses are accredited by the Royal College of Nursing and Health Education England.

Career opportunities

Graduates will be able to undertake an ACP role within their speciality, setting or sector with excellent opportunities for promotion. Clinical Optometry MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year taught course plus up to one year for the dissertation

Part-time: two years taught course plus up to one year for the dissertation (September and January starts)

Preparing optometrists to provide enhanced clinical care to patients, the course emphasises the co-management of patients and the expansion of the optometrist's role in ocular therapeutics.

The course has an international reputation for quality and is at the forefront of professional clinical optometry education. Students acquire skills and knowledge from leading UK experts in a dynamic learning environment.

Psychology

Behavioural Economics MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

Behavioural Economics applies psychological insights to human behaviour to investigate how people make economic decisions under various conditions of constraint (e.g., time and knowledge) and influence (e.g., social pressure). This is an important field in modern economics and the social sciences more generally.

Commercial organisations have long known the limitations of individual decision-making and they routinely use this knowledge in their commercial practices (e.g., the anchoring effect of minimum payment on credit cards). The real-world implications of behavioural economics are varied and significant and acknowledged to provide a powerful and cost-effective approach to improving human welfare.

The course is taught by psychologists and economists offering students a good foundation in both disciplines.

Career opportunities

Behavioural economists use data to better understand human behaviour. These highly valuable skills can be applied in a range of professions, for example to formulate policies or to analyse consumer behaviour. There is increasing demand for behavioural economists across different sectors, including financial trading and risk assessment, consumer psychology and marketing, consulting and public policy. The research focus of the course also allows graduates to proceed to PhD level research in economics or psychology.

Psychology (conversion)
MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course is accredited by the British Psychological Society and is designed to enable graduates in a discipline other than psychology to convert their existing qualification, providing the necessary basis for progression to postgraduate training in psychology, and therefore eligibility for Chartered membership (CPsychol) of the British Psychological Society. It delivers the core content of a psychology undergraduate degree through a flexible and innovative delivery approach to master's study.

Module topics such as biological psychology, cognitive psychology and developmental psychology provide students with a breadth of knowledge while enabling them to develop their personal interests in the human mind. In addition, students complete an empirical project, which will give them the opportunity to dig deeper into a particular area of psychology, gaining cutting-edge expertise and valuable research experience.

Career opportunities

Graduates pursue roles in clinical, educational, forensic, health, sport, and occupational psychology. Some apply psychological principles in business contexts, such as human resources or market research. Additionally, an academic psychologist offers opportunities in research or teaching. It's important to note that the majority of these specialisations will require further training and experience.

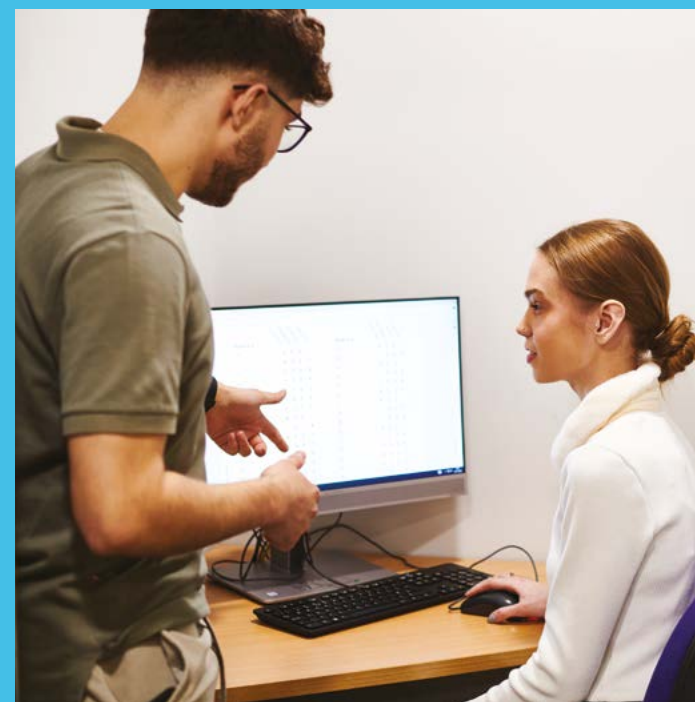

Postgraduate research degrees



The School of Health & Psychological Sciences is committed to enhancing health and wellbeing by partnering with healthcare users and practitioners, and delivering research that is innovative, usable and policy-relevant.

The School's research centres, which focus on eight key areas: maternal and child health, applied vision, health services research, language and communication science, mental health, healthcare innovation, psychology and food policy, offer a supportive and well-resourced environment for individuals wishing to pursue a postgraduate research degree (both MPhil and PhD).

Students benefit from individualised supervision, participate in regular seminars, and can take up a suite of development activities based on their training needs. These might include patient and public involvement and engagement, research methods, methods of analysis and interpretation, and dissemination

strategies. They may also choose to gain experience in teaching.

Academic staff and students benefit from recent multi-million-pound investment in new facilities including bespoke laboratories, public-facing clinics and simulation suites. Additionally, the School is uniquely placed to offer PhD students access to University of London research facilities, including its own extensive clinical networks.

Examples of PhD research include: public health nutrition advocacy in the UK; patients' quality of life with glaucoma; risk perception regarding pregnancy and childbirth; patients' reconstructive memories of critical care and nurses' understanding and response to these; addressing health inequalities in disadvantaged groups using health psychology theory and evidence and neurodevelopment and risk factors in schizophrenia.

Full-time: three years

There are three routes to an MPhil/PhD degree within the School:

- **Major Thesis:** students undertake a significant piece of original research and write a thesis based on that research.
- **Thesis incorporating Prospective Publications:** students undertake a significant piece of original research and prepare articles for publication in peer-reviewed academic journals as they proceed through their period of study. In the thesis, the published articles may be embedded within chapters which also contain the critical analysis, or they may be interspersed among chapters written in traditional thesis style.
- **Prior Publication:** students who have published a significant body of articles in peer-reviewed academic journals spend between one and two years writing an extended treatise which draws this research together with analysis of previously published work by others into the context of a single overarching thesis.

Graduate Diploma in Law GDL

Duration

Full-time: one year

The course is for non-law graduates wishing to engage in careers as barristers or solicitors. Uniquely, part of The City Law School's Foundations of law module is an introduction to legal ethics, to the values that characterise the profession and the ethical challenges lawyers might face in practice. The course comprises of the seven core foundation subjects normally covered within a qualifying law degree.

Alongside fundamental legal knowledge, students will develop essential legal skills such as research, analysis, and problem-solving and advocacy. These are prerequisites for taking the professional training course for the Bar. They are also the basis of the knowledge needed for those intending to become solicitors.

Students have the option to convert to an LLB degree by taking further law modules.

Career opportunities

Successful completion qualifies students to progress on to the Bar Vocational Studies (BVS) for intending barristers, or the Solicitors' Practice Programme (SPP) for intending solicitors. The programme will be advantageous for those going on to prepare for the Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE). Full-time: two years

The senior status law course is a rigorous and competitive programme and allows non-law graduates to receive an LLB law degree in just two years.

Students have the opportunity to gain skills and knowledge in core legal subjects and specialist areas of law.

In year one, candidates study four of the seven core foundation subjects usually covered in an undergraduate law degree. In year two, students take the remaining three core subjects and have the opportunity to enhance their knowledge of particular areas of law by choosing six elective modules.

The course attracts international students from around the world, Canada in particular. Canadian law-specific electives can be chosen in year two.

There are opportunities for students to develop legal skills in mooting, legal research and legal writing, and to take part in various pro bono projects.

Career opportunities

Successful completion of the course qualifies students to progress to one of our two professional courses: the Solicitors' Practice Programme (SPP) for solicitors or the Bar Vocational Studies (BVS) for barristers. Students can also pursue a Master of Laws (LLM).

 **Duration**

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years


The course offers the choice of three different routes depending on whether students simply wish to qualify as a barrister or whether they wish to further enhance their employability and develop specialist knowledge and skills.

The course is available as full-time or part-time study. Students who choose to study part-time will have classes on two days per week, over two years, allowing them to work alongside their studies.

The Postgraduate Diploma with Specialism, which includes two additional modules in a specialist area of professional practice, allows students to further develop a critical understanding of the law, procedure and real-world insights in the context of that area.

Students also have the option of obtaining an LLM by completing a practice-focused dissertation or clinical legal education module (which includes undertaking supervised clinical legal work)* in addition to the compulsory vocational qualification for the Bar and the specialist modules. This route aims to enhance students' knowledge of substantive law and/or legal skills in relation to a particular area of professional practice and offers the opportunity for extended practical experience.

**The clinical legal education module is only available to full-time students.*

 **Career opportunities**

On successful completion, students will have obtained the vocational stage of training for the Bar of England and Wales required to become a barrister.

As well as preparing students for a successful career as a barrister, the range of skills developed on this programme are also highly transferable to successful careers in a wide range of other areas. The Solicitors' Practice Programme is designed for those preparing for the Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE), the new route to qualifying as a solicitor in England and Wales.


Over two 10-week terms, students will study material that will help prepare them to pass SQE1 and SQE2. Students may exit at this stage with a Postgraduate Diploma.

The Master of Laws (LLM) pathway provides an additional 5-week elective term and a legal practice research project to deepen students' understanding of an area of legal practice that is of particular interest.

Students will build on their existing legal knowledge and will acquire the knowledge and skills required both for the SQE assessments and for practising as a solicitor.

The Future Solicitors Advisory Service (FSAS) provides dedicated advice to help our students to secure the workplace experience they will need in order to qualify as a solicitor.

Students can also participate in the School's pro bono activities and work with real clients.

The award of a PhD requires the submission of a thesis for examination at a *viva voce* (oral examination) by two examiners, at least one of whom is external to City. The thesis must be an original and substantial piece of work which makes a contribution to the relevant literature. All students are initially registered for an MPhil degree. Those students who wish to proceed to a PhD must upgrade within 18 months (30 months for part-time students).

Students learn the latest deep learning architectures, such as CNNs, RNNs, and transformer-based models (GPT, diffusion models, and YOLO), used, for example, in health, power systems, the creative sector, computer vision, climate prediction, cognitive and neuroscience modelling, and natural language processing.

The course has a unique nature-based approach and the right balance between theory and practice, nurturing hands-on and project-based training in a collaborative environment.

Students have access to the necessary GPU computational power, a dedicated AI lab and a High-Performance Computing node.

The purpose of this course is to explore and research theories and techniques for using artificial intelligence (AI) in the design of technology mediated devices, systems and services together with investigating the ways users experience AI in their lives. The foundation of the course is an exploration of human capabilities, technology and the business constraints when creating and deploying novel technologies.

These topics are underpinned by considering issues such as data ownership and IP, living with algorithm-based decisions, privacy, security, trust and corporate versus societal responsibility.

This course is intended for those with responsibility for ensuring that technology innovation, particularly where AI is used in the design or delivery of functionality, is usable by people in a way that is successful and satisfying.

Graduates would be equipped to gain roles such as user experience (UX) consultant, UX researcher, UX designer, UX developer, product manager, information architect, usability specialist and accessibility specialist. (15 months with internship)
Part-time: 28 months

The course is designed for graduates of computing-related degrees who want to further specialise their undergraduate education and develop their careers in the games industry. It is also for those who wish to update their skills after time spent in industry as a computing professional and for those with equivalent experience.

Students develop strong technical skills and specialist knowledge in computer graphics, VR, artificial intelligence, physics and audio in addition to developing the ability to design and build game engines from scratch in industry standard languages, including C++.

Students specialise in several aspects of cyber security, including cryptography, network security, information security and security audit. They engage with academics to develop their scientific knowledge and skills and are offered the option to specialise in the sociotechnical aspects of security, cybercrime and digital forensics.

The course focuses on machine learning as the most exciting technology around data, which graduates confirm is highly valued in employment. Students also explore areas like data visualisation to generate insight from data and communicate it in practice.

Data Science Apprenticeship

Part-time: 28 months (with three months end point assessment)

Apprentices develop specialist skills in data acquisition, information extraction, aggregation and representation, data analysis, knowledge extraction and explanation, which are in high demand in many fields. The apprenticeship combines taught material and on-the-job training. The next generation of scientific discovery and innovation will be data-driven as previously unrecognised patterns are discovered by analysing massive and mixed data sets. Leadership skills developed within the programme include the ability to oversee and manage complex data science projects, like assessing project feasibility and risk analysis.

The course meets the requirements of the Digital and Technology Solutions Specialist (Integrated Degree) Data Analytics Specialist apprenticeship programme.

Selected students will have the opportunity to explore the international fintech sector through collaboration with City's international partners including Lloyds Banking Group, Allica Bank, Thirdfort, EarthID and moneyHOP.

Human-Computer Interaction Design

MSc

Duration

Full-time: 12 months (15 months with internship)
Part-time: 28 months

The course provides students with advanced knowledge, industry-desired skills and new perspectives on design, thoroughly preparing them for a career in user-centred design or user research.

It equips students with the latest academic research, theories and techniques in human-computer interaction (HCI), user experience (UX), usability and interaction design. It encourages students to think about design in new ways, recognising that there are many 'right' ways to design.

Students gain a combination of theoretical and real-world knowledge, along with the necessary skills and experience to create engaging user experiences. They study modules that cover the entire user-centred design and evaluation process, from understanding user needs to designing interactive systems that meet those needs, to evaluating the usability of those (and existing) systems through user research. Students also gain experience in participatory design approaches.

Career opportunities

The course empowers students to succeed in UX roles in leading digital agencies, business consultancies, IT companies and government. Recent graduate positions include UX designer/consultant, user researcher, information architect and accessibility specialist.

The course is highly respected by industry and has high employability prospects. Graduate destinations have included Samsung, Tesco, Thomson Reuters and Google.

Software Engineering with Cloud Computing MSc

Duration

Full-time: 12 months
(15 months with internship)
Part-time: 28 months

This is an industry-focused course for computer science graduates and experienced professional programmers interested in developing high-quality, complex software systems.

The course develops skills in analysing system requirements and designing appropriate software solutions, evaluating and using advanced software engineering environments, design methods and programming languages.

It offers an up-to-the-minute curriculum with a robust professional core. There is a strong focus on key industrial technologies, including cloud computing, object-oriented languages (Java, C++), security, big data and mainstream standards.

City has one of the largest groups of academics in London specialising in research in the areas of systems and software engineering. Students are exposed to leading-edge technologies delivered by experts in their fields.

Career opportunities

The course aims to meet the significant demand for graduates with a good knowledge of software engineering. This demand arises from consultancies; software houses; major software users such as banks, retailers and public services; and defence, aerospace and telecommunications companies.

Advanced Aerospace Engineering with Sustainable Technologies MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year

Students develop the knowledge, skills and values needed for a career in the growing aerospace industry, with a particular emphasis on multidisciplinary aerospace technologies aimed at reducing environmental impact.

City is one of the few universities in the UK that offers a combination of green aerospace technologies and advanced manufacturing that is focused on the requirements, challenges and possible solutions of technologies that promote sustainability in aviation.

Students will study both theory and practice related to the analysis, design, and evaluation of aerospace engineering systems and the underlying technologies, with the option to specialise in the field of automation and autonomy in aircraft and ground systems by taking a specifically designed module.

Students benefit from internationally recognised research expertise and facilities including wind tunnels that are part of the UK National Wind Tunnel Facility consortium, flight simulators and a UAV laboratory.

Career opportunities

The UK currently has the second largest aerospace industry in the world, employing around 230,000 people in over 3,000 companies, including BAE Systems and Rolls-Royce, and a range of international companies with operations in the UK, such as Airbus, Lockheed Martin, Thales, Boeing, and Spirit AeroSystems.

Aviation Management Executive MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: three years

Delivered by experts from industry, this course is intended to enhance the contributions that experienced aviation professionals can make to their organisations. Students will learn the latest management techniques, freshen their current knowledge and build a network of peers. It is suited for those with at least two years' work experience within the aviation industry who want to study for an Executive MBA-style qualification. Students with a relevant undergraduate degree or a military background are also welcomed.

Students specialise in one of three pathways, allowing them to personalise their studies based on their interests: Airline and Airport Management, Aircraft Maintenance Management and Air Safety Management.

With multiple entry points and both part-time and full-time structures available, this is a great course that offers students flexibility around current commitments.

The course is recognised by the aviation industry and approved by the Royal Aeronautical Society. Full-time: one year

It is directed towards graduates and professionals with an engineering background who want to obtain a significant understanding of the biomedical engineering field.

The course is uniquely interdisciplinary. It covers the signal aspect of biological functions and the design of biomedical instrumentation and sensors coupled with data analytics for processing, analysing and securely storing medical data, with elements of ethics and big data management.

The course takes advantage of the strong Biomedical Engineering Research Centre in the School of Science & Technology and actively involves clinical and industrial partners in seminars and internship projects.

Full-time: one year
Part-time: either two or three years

Energy and Environmental Technology and Economics MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The drive towards increased efficiency and decarbonisation of power generation, transport, industry and domestic energy use will require professionals with the ability to see beyond traditional subject boundaries and understand the complex inter-relations between technological, economic, political and behavioural aspects of the energy sector.

The course aims to instil the knowledge and vision required to deliver a sustainable future. It maintains strong links with industry, which provides students with a range of perspectives on current issues relating to energy policy, low-carbon technologies, user behaviour, energy markets and regulation.

The course contains pathways that qualify as further learning for accreditation with the Energy Institute for Chartered Engineer and Energy Manager status.

With strong industry links, expert lecturers and a diverse range of modules on offer, the course equips graduates to become leaders and entrepreneurs in energy management, supply or policy-making.

Maritime Operations and Management MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year with the project taking approximately three months during this period

Part-time: two to three years with the project taking approximately six months within this period

The course is designed to train professionals for the maritime and sea transport industries. It is open to graduates who have qualified in an appropriate discipline and to those serving at sea, offshore or in inland-based organisations.

The course focuses on maritime operations, management, law and technology and the related business environment, with an emphasis on port security and risk management, marine environmental and offshore studies, marketing and selected aspects of conceptual ship design.

The course hosts prestigious visiting speakers and is accredited by the Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers. Successful students can apply for exemption from certain examinations of the Institute. It is also accredited by the Institute of Marine Engineering, Science and Technology and can lead to students becoming a Chartered Marine Technologist.

Career opportunities

Graduates have wide-ranging employment opportunities, including commercial, technical and senior management roles within the worldwide marine industry.

Former students have taken up positions in the fields of ship and insurance broking, offshore operations, port and terminal management, shipping finance, surveying, ship superintendence and safety management and as technical and commercial managers and directors.

Maritime Safety and Security Management MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year with the project taking approximately three months during this period

Part-time: two to three years with the project taking approximately six months within this period

Safety and security are important aspects of the maritime industries. These include protection and regulation, incident investigation and management, piracy, cybersecurity, risk and uncertainty, resilience, human factors and leadership and management.

The course is directed towards professionals from the merchant marines, navies and those in land-based maritime occupations. Students should have a good grounding in their respective academic discipline or considerable work-based experience.

While focusing principally on maritime and offshore issues, there is an emphasis on the related fields of port security and the preservation of the marine environment. Students also benefit from prestigious visiting speakers from industry to talk on specialist topics. Additionally, the course takes advantage of the importance of London as an international maritime hub.

Career opportunities

The course is multidisciplinary and is designed to develop safety and security experts who are technically literate and understand risk and uncertainty analysis of maritime safety issues, design effective practices and contribute insights from applied research. It is focused towards management and leadership careers in marine safety management in the marine and offshore sectors and policy or regulatory organisations.

Project Management, Finance and Risk MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course provides students with a foundation in quantitative risk assessment and decision-making coupled with classical engineering economics and financial engineering.

Students unravel complex problems by applying scientific methods to real-world examples and discover how to measure risk on any scale.

From analysing indecision within game theory to rebuilding a country's infrastructure, students explore the drivers of how businesses operate and the challenges and opportunities that project managers face.

Combining expertise from City academic staff and visiting lecturers from industry, the course merges diverse and unique skill sets to solve complex problems.

The course is suited to students with a scientific or financial engineering background as the focus is on quantitative risk assessment, which requires an aptitude for problem-solving.

Career opportunities

Graduates are prepared for a wide range of career opportunities involving project management, risk management and financial planning. It is well suited to those pursuing a career managing complex projects, applying the latest management tools and techniques.

Renewable Energy and Power Systems Management MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The course, suitable for both practising engineers and those considering a career in engineering, has been designed to provide an in-depth insight into the technical workings, management and economics of the electrical power industry.

Due to the introduction of tough environmental laws, the use and integration of renewable energy schemes are now of paramount importance for nations to meet strict low-pollution targets. Knowledge of the impact of such schemes on the existing electrical grid structure is covered in great detail. In addition, modules covering power electronics, smart grids, power systems protection, modelling, simulation and design are addressed alongside economics, supply chain and market factors.

The course has been developed for graduates with electrical/electronic or related engineering or scientific backgrounds to meet the increasing demand from the energy and power industry.

Career opportunities

Students are prepared for careers that encompass a range of roles in the power industry, from technical aspects to management roles. Graduates have found jobs as engineers, managers and analysts in the power sector with companies such as Ofgem, National Grid, UK Power Networks, E.ON, EDF Energy, Vattenfall, Caterpillar and the transport sector.

Students may also wish to further their research in the energy field by undertaking a PhD.

Robotics, AI and Autonomous Systems MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years
and four months

This course is designed to develop successful engineering specialists in the emerging industry of robotics, AI and autonomous systems. It is suited for graduates and professionals who want to cultivate skills to face the challenges of this desirable market.

The course adopts robotics and AI as instruments for the design and deployment of autonomous systems. Students gain in-depth knowledge of recent advances in relevant domains: robotics, machine learning and imaging, human-machine/machine-machine teaming, communications, embedded systems and control. They also explore the regulations framework of autonomous systems, and the ethical issues arising from their utilisation.

The course organisers work closely with industry and prestigious research institutions to offer students relevant lectures/guest seminars, tutorials, laboratory coursework, design projects and industry/research-oriented dissertations.

Career opportunities

Graduates in Robotics, AI and Autonomous Systems are sought for employment opportunities in several branches of industry including automotive/transportation, robotics, aerospace, defence, energy and manufacturing.

Skills acquired, including software and hardware robotics, AI/ML, image processing and computer vision, are attractive for a wide range of well-established companies and SMEs linked to the autonomous systems and AI market and beyond.

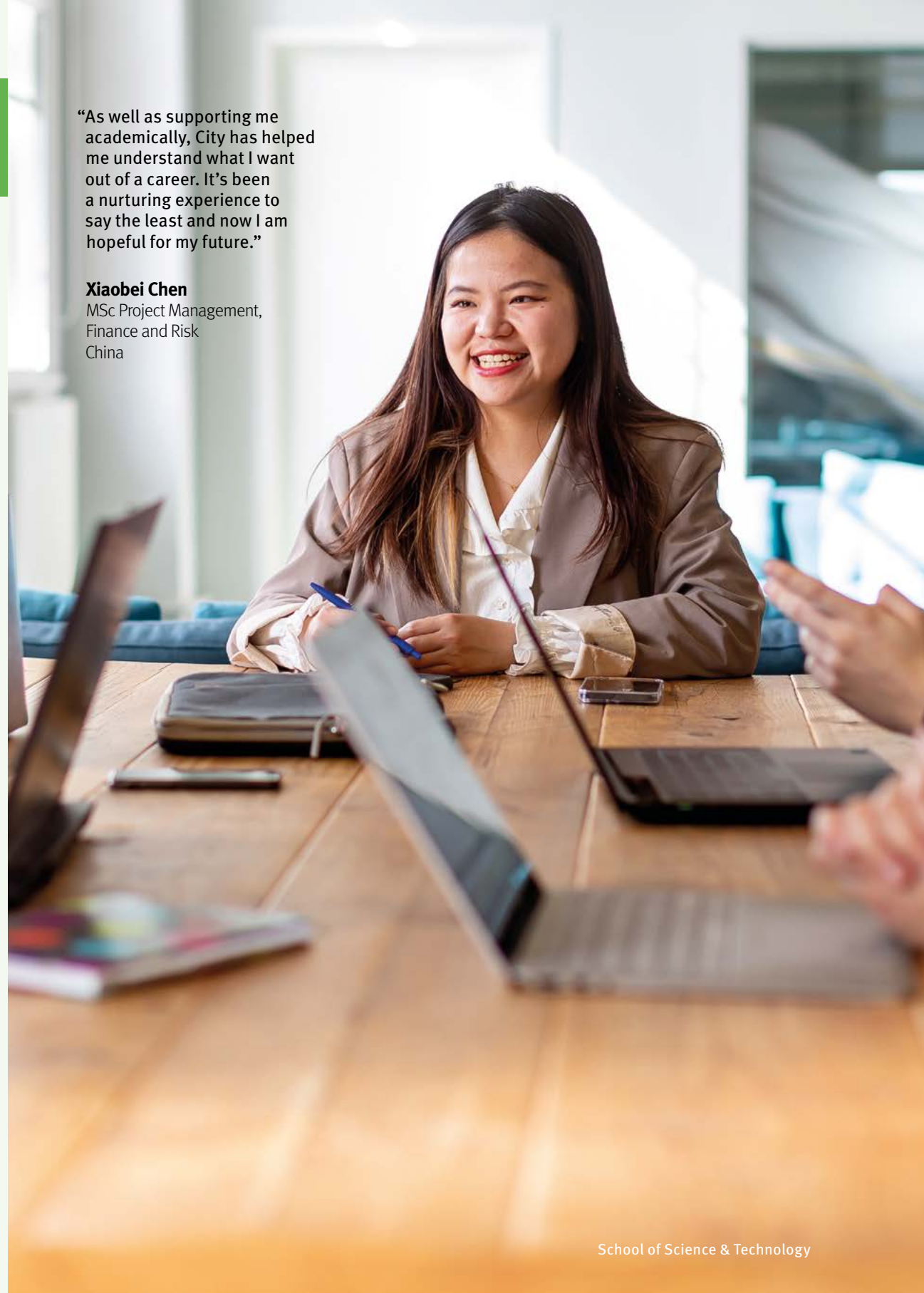

Space Mission Analysis and Design

MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year
Part-time: two years

The most important phase in planning space operations is space mission analysis and design. This phase determines the technical and business parameters needed for a space operation to be successful. This unique course incorporates launch, operations and law, enabling the analysis to be comprehensive. It has been designed to develop the careers of both professionals and new graduates to understand how the space sector can be shaped by commercial and governmental organisations.

The course equips students with the skills to plan a space mission from inception to completion and teaches the management of a space mission within the constraints of the law and safety regulations.

City's laboratory sessions concentrate on extensive use of immersive simulation using NASA's General Mission Analysis Tool and MATLAB with a space module to emulate real space missions to test plans and designs.

Career opportunities

The course offers an advanced qualification for entry into the rapidly growing space sector, which is expanding by 10 to 20 per cent annually. With more countries entering space operations, vacancies exceed the supply of qualified applicants. Those currently employed in the sector can enhance their careers to middle technology/management positions and beyond by gaining additional knowledge to add to experience.

Postgraduate research degrees



The School of Science & Technology has a vibrant research community with an interdisciplinary perspective and a broad understanding of the impact of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) on society.

STEM permeates nearly every aspect of life. As the pace of innovation accelerates and technology grows ever more complex, science and technology are becoming increasingly interdisciplinary, demanding an approach that spans multiple academic disciplines and includes a broader perspective.

Research in the School focuses on both tackling fundamental scientific questions and solving real-world problems. Through its PhD courses, the School trains future leaders capable of incorporating both technical and non-technical considerations in academia, business, government and the not-for-profit sector.

Research degrees

MPhil/PhD

Duration

Full-time: three years
Part-time: five to six years

The School welcomes applications from candidates who are interested in studying for a research degree to address an exciting, unsolved problem and advance their career.

The School offers the following types of research degrees: PhD by Major Thesis; PhD by Prospective Publication; PhD by Prior Publication; and MPhil.

The School is home to the following research centres, comprising teams of academic staff with international reputations in their fields: Software Reliability; gi (data visualisation); Human-Computer Interaction Design; Artificial Intelligence; Mathematics; Biomedical Engineering; Sensors and Instrumentation; Photonics and Instrumentation; Sustainable and Resilient Civil Engineering; Systems, Aeronautics and Aerospace; Autonomy and Control; Thermo-Fluids; and London Space Innovation.

All doctoral students are initially registered as MPhil students, except when they have transferred from another institution and have provided suitable and appropriate evidence that permits direct registration as a PhD student.

A research degree provides a superb opportunity for able students to dig deep into a specialist area to advance knowledge for the benefit of many. It is a remarkably satisfying and rewarding venture.

Helping to fund your studies

Postgraduate study at City is an affordable option for students from a wide range of backgrounds.

Although students will usually have to pay for postgraduate study themselves, many sources of funding exist including scholarships, studentships and loans. During their time at City, students can obtain financial advice and support from City's award-winning Student Centre.

Scholarships and loans

Postgraduate scholarships

City has a wide range of scholarships available to students in all six of its Schools. There are also externally funded scholarships open to both home and international students, including the Chevening Scholarships designed to develop global leaders and the Commonwealth Scholarships for those looking to make a positive change in the world.

Research Councils studentships

Research Councils may be able to provide financial assistance for UK, EU and overseas postgraduate students. It is best to contact the council relevant to the specific area of study directly to enquire about eligibility and application.

Charities and trusts

There may be funding for postgraduate study available from charities and trusts. The British Council has a scholarship search database that many find helpful.

Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)

Students can apply for Disabled Students' Allowance if they live in England and have a disability that affects their ability to study, such as a learning difficulty, a mental health condition, a physical disability or a long-term health condition.

Hardship Fund

City's Hardship Fund provides discretionary financial assistance for students experiencing unexpected financial hardship to help them remain in higher education. The Fund is administered by the Student Centre and is intended to act as a safety net for those in financial difficulty.

Postgraduate loans (UK students only)

Postgraduate loans are available from the Government to help cover the cost of postgraduate study. Students undertaking a master's degree can apply for up to £12,471* to help pay tuition fees or living expenses. The loan is non-means tested and paid directly to the student.

If a student is interested in undertaking a research degree, they can apply for a Postgraduate Doctoral Loan for up to £28,673*, divided equally across each year of the course.

Supporting international students

With a diverse student population drawn from 159 countries, City's vibrant atmosphere makes it a special place to study.

Choosing to study abroad is one of the biggest decisions some students make, which is why City offers advice and support at every step of the journey.

A dedicated international team

In addition to hosting regular online events, the International Student Recruitment team visits over 50 countries each year, meeting prospective students interested in studying at City. Additionally, a worldwide network of approved agent representatives is on hand to help students with their applications.

International Student Advice

Our specialist International Student Advice and Compliance team helps international students with immigration queries and concerns and supports them to settle in with a series of activities during Welcome Week, designed specifically for international students.

Visa requirements

Students are responsible for obtaining necessary visas and entry clearance into the UK and are advised to prepare in advance by researching the requirements for students from their home country. Information about applying for, and extending, visas to study is available on City's website.

If students have an existing Student visa that was issued for study at another university, college or school in the UK, they will need to complete a new Student visa application with the UK Home Office using a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from City before they will be allowed to register.

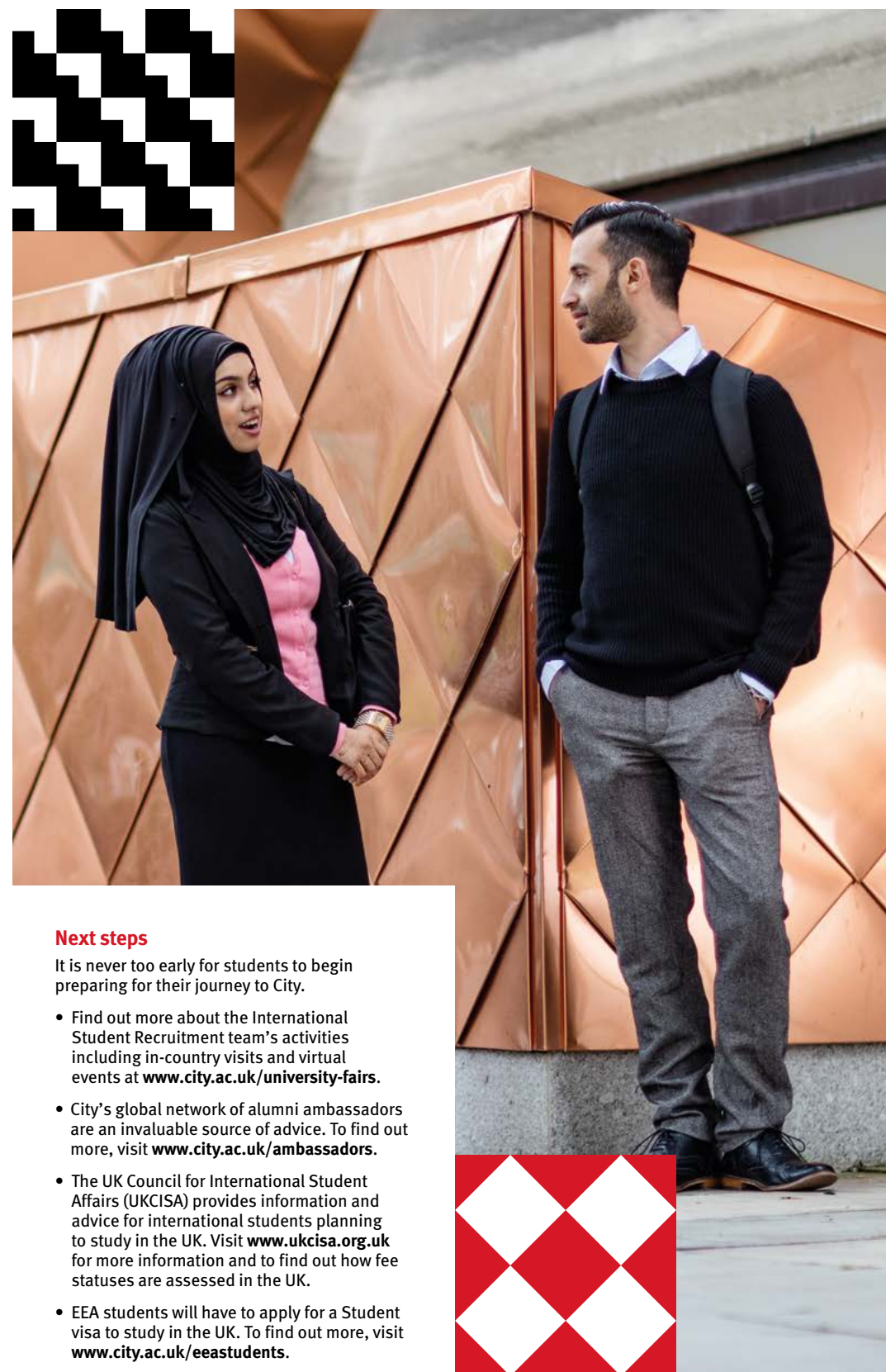
A team of dedicated International Student Advisers can help with the visa application process.

English language requirements and courses

As City's courses are delivered in English, students whose first language is not English will need to demonstrate their English ability is sufficient to undertake degree-level study. English language requirements vary by course and are likely to be higher than the minimum English language requirements set by the Home Office for students requiring a visa. INTO City runs pre-session English courses during the summer to help students improve their English before their courses start. Bayes Business School postgraduate students are only eligible for Pre-session English if referred by the MSc Admissions team.

Applying to City

Choosing a postgraduate course at City is the beginning of a journey towards a rewarding career.

How to apply

Applications for the majority of postgraduate courses need to be made directly to City. To apply, visit the webpage of the intended course of study and click on the 'How to apply' tab to read more about the application process, including any supporting documentation required and to access the online application system.

With a few exceptions, most postgraduate courses do not have a fixed application deadline and operate on a rolling admission basis. Applications will close when the course is full, so students are encouraged to apply as early as possible. Where a deadline is in place, further information can be found on the specific course webpage.

Entry requirements

Entry requirements vary for each course and are listed on the individual course webpages.

Applicants for postgraduate study should normally hold a university honours degree in a relevant subject. However, if students do not hold an honours degree (or an equivalent qualification) but have suitable experience or professional qualifications, they may still be accepted for a master's course or a Postgraduate Diploma at the discretion of the relevant School.

Students who are in the final year of their undergraduate studies or are yet to receive their English Language test results can still apply for most postgraduate courses at City. Their applications will be assessed based on predicted grades and, if all other entry criteria are met, applicants might receive a conditional offer that is subject to them satisfying the specified requirements.

Pre-master's courses provide a route to several of City's courses for international students that do not qualify for direct entry. Students can take a City-validated course with INTO City or study with City's partner, Kaplan International College London. Courses at both providers guarantee progression to City for students that meet the required grades.

Tuition fees and living costs

Tuition fees vary by course and further information can be found on the website. Remember that tuition fees do not include the cost of accommodation, so students will need to budget for this along with flights, food, travel, books and personal items. Where necessary, City's temping agency, Unitemps, can help students find suitable work.

Some courses may require a tuition fee deposit following an offer of admission to confirm applicant's place on the course.

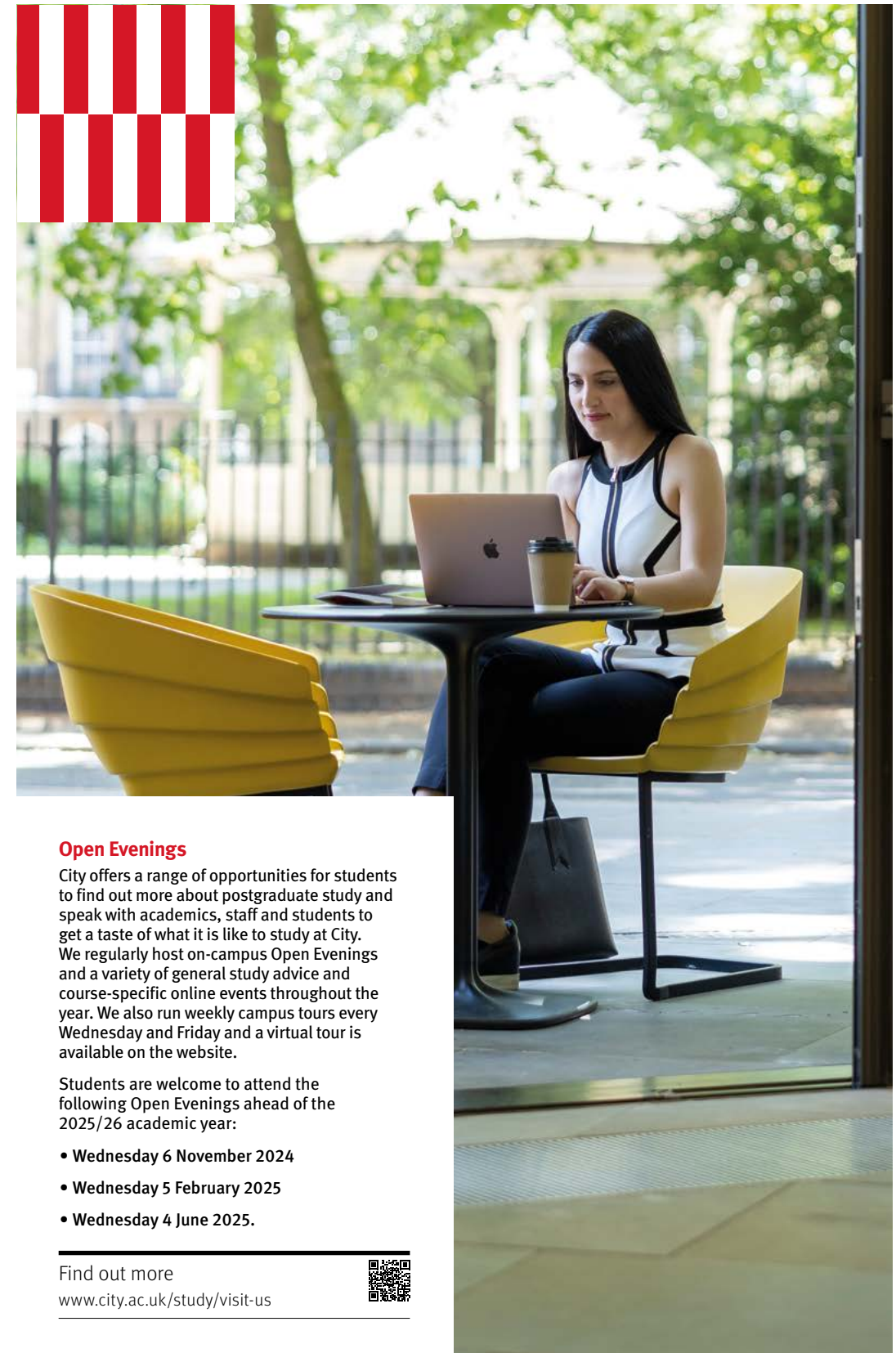

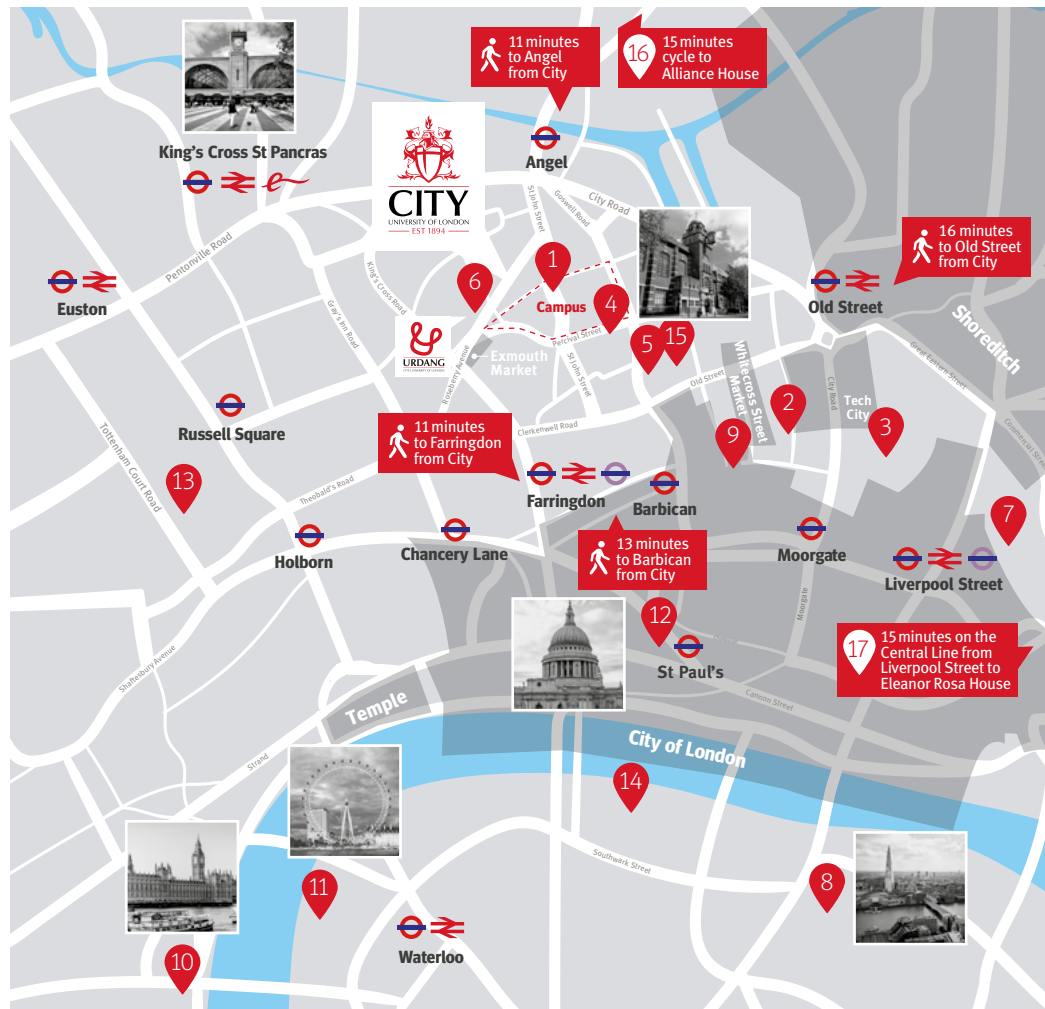

Reaching City from within London

The nearest Underground stations are Angel on the Northern line (Bank branch) and Barbican and Farringdon on the Metropolitan, Circle and Hammersmith & City lines. Farringdon also serves the Elizabeth Line (Crossrail).

Bus routes that pass close to City include the following: 4, 19, 30, 38, 43, 55, 56, 63, 73, 153, 205, 214, 243, 274, 341, 394, 476.

Secure parking for bicycles is available on campus.

Parking in central London is limited and can be expensive. There is metered parking available on the roads surrounding Northampton Square. Please also note that almost all of City's sites are within the congestion charging zone and drivers are liable to pay a daily charge.

Rail services connect Gatwick and Luton airports with Farringdon station.
